### April 2011 Meeting Minutes

April 28, 2011

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Chair Roger Verstraete. There were 25 members present and one guest, Jeff Mangels. Attending members introduced themselves.

The minutes of March 30, 2011 were approved.

Car show fliers for the September show were discussed. Debra Gragg will check with Sir Speedy for printing 1000 copies.

Harold Haskell reported the club is now a member of the Associated Car Clubs of Kansas City (ACCKC). It was also noted that club banner replacement is being explored.

Motion by Ed Smoot, seconded by Rocky Hill, to appoint the current board for the 2011-2012 period. Motion by Debra Gragg to amend motion to open the floor for nominations. Motion failed for lack of second. The vote on original motion passed.

The members then discussed show events and activities. It was suggested adding the club's website and a notation that more than 100 Chevelles/El Caminos participate in the show on next year's fliers.

The 2011 Chevell-A-Bration event was discussed. Members were polled regarding departure days and times. Members will decide on a time and location for those wishing to caravan to Goodlettsville, TN.

Members were reminded of the upcoming Midwest Chevelle Regional hosted by the Queen City Chevelle Club in Springfield, MO, on July 8 and 9.

Shari Hill informed those in attendance of the May 14 cruise to Dream Cars in Warrensburg, Missouri to view vintage and muscle cars. Reservations for lunch following the tour were made at Hero's in downtown Warrensburg. Members will meet at Quik Trip, 107<sup>th</sup> and Roe, with departure time of 9:30 a.m. Dave Wagner informed the members of a friend who would photograph members cars, which would include a group shot, 2 car pictures, and a specialty shot for \$25.00 for each member desiring. Shari indicated she is working on more area tours.

The audience was informed of a garage tour event for May 28, 2011. The day will begin with breakfast at Smoky's in Wellsville, KS at 8:30 a.m. The first garage to tour will be the Byfield's, the Gragg's, and the Yuran's in rural Leavenworth county. ### President's Column

Hi MACC members

This month I would like to make sure everyone in the club knows about what is going on with our club. I know a lot of people can't make it to all of the meetings and are interested in what is happening. First of all, we had elections last month and everyone that held a position with the club wanted to serve for another year. Everyone ran unopposed and all were re-elected.

After the October meeting last year, which was five days after our car show, I asked everyone at the meeting for comments and suggestions for next year's show. One of the suggestions that everyone agreed on was a different car show flyer. So, Mike Stites knows a graphic designer and he made us a new flyer for the car show. It is attached to the email with this month's newsletter and I think everyone will like it. On the backside of the flyer we put all of the information and event schedule. We should have them ready to hand out soon.





At the March meeting we discussed the price structure for our show and we made a lot of changes to it. In the past we charged \$30.00 if you registered before September 1<sup>st</sup> and \$40.00 the day of the show. The entry price also included 2 meal tickets. This year we are charging a \$25.00 entry fee no matter when you sign up, and then if you want to come to the dinner it is \$8.00 per person. I met several people last year at different car shows and they were not sure if they could make it, and didn't want to commit early and felt \$40.00 was a little pricey the day of the show, especially if they could only come Saturday. I believe this price change will help us for walk-up registration for Friday and Saturday. On Friday the show starts at Noon, and the poker run/cruise will start at 5:30 and end around 7:00. The Friday Night Cookout will start right after that. This event is put on by Mid America Chevelle Club members in appreciation for all Chevelle owners who attend our show. The cookout is a donation only, and it is just to cover the cost of food. This is a great time to just visit with all of our friends and people who attend our show. This was a big hit last year and I encourage everyone to come, even if you don't want to put your car in the show you are welcome to come. It ends around 10:00PM.

We are looking for different ways to promote the car show and if you have any ideas please feel free to contact me and we can discuss any ideas you have. If anyone has a contact with the local media, we are looking for some free advertising. Last year we were on Fox 4 and KCTV 5 Saturday morning events schedule. Ron Brightwell got us some free airtime on a local radio station. All these things help get the word out about the show and the club. Anything free is always good. Debra and Sheila are getting everything ready to mail out postcards to anyone that has come in the last 5 years and all "ACES" members in an eight state area. Last year, club members passed out show flyers at local car shows and cruises to get the word out about the show. I have talked to several Chevelle owners so far this year, and they knew about the club and the car show at the Great Plains Mall. So, the efforts of getting the word out about our club and car show are working.

Rocky and Shari are working on some more cruises in the upcoming months. Future plans include a trip up to St. Joe and Topeka. The annual picnic in Iola, KS is set for the end of August. On Saturday, May 28<sup>th</sup> we are having our first garage tour to three members' houses to see the cars they are building and their collection of Chevelles. The tour will start at Old 56 Hi Way Restaurant in Olathe for breakfast, and then we are off to Rick Byfield's garage in Edgerton, KS. After that we will be going to John Gragg's house to see his cars and garage. When we are done there it is off to Dan Yuran's building to see his collection of cars and cars he is currently building. 
