May 2011 Meeting Minutes

May 26, 2011

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Chair Roger Verstraete at Superior Chevrolet. There were 27 members in attendance; no introductions were made.

Danny McKarnin provided information regarding the club's annual picnic at Iola, Kansas. He stated the August 27 event would also host a tour of the Iola power plant and a few stops to thank last year's sponsors. He reported he is still researching resources for a new club banner.

Roger Verstraete reported there are club shirts and hats available.

Ron Brightwell informed the attendees he recently attended a car show which awarded plaques with the individual's car's picture and questioned if this is something worth investigating. Several indicated there is a lot of labor and coordination to complete and there was not a consensus to explore.

Rocky Hill indicated he is looking at some award changes which could include a Lucite stand up trophy. He also reported the t-shirts will be tone-on-tone black with images in off-shades of black/gray/blue.

Roger Verstraete suggested Dean Call choose the club choice award. Dean will be approached with this suggestion. Roger also noted he will be checking with Superior Chevrolet for any assistance or promotion they would desire to provide.

Eugene Hallouer provided the treasurer's report which was accepted and informed the members present there are currently 40 paid memberships.

Shari Hill informed the members of an upcoming cruise to a winery in St. Joseph, MO on June 26 which would include a picnic at the winery and a visit to the Patee House Museum. More information will be provided via newsletter and e-mails.

We followed up the tour with a visit to the Gibson's for snacks and refreshments (many thanks to the Gibson's for hosting the crew). We got to check out their other hot rod – a '67 Nova and the water garden.

For myself and eleven other members, we just got back from Chevell-A-Bration in Goodlettsville, Tennessee. We had five cars on the show field; two came down on trailers and three were driven. Attendance was down, but it did not dampen the sprits of the ones that were there. This was my second time I went to Chevell-A-Bration, and the first time I took my car. Some of us didn't get there until Thursday evening so we missed the drag races. That gave us a chance to clean up our cars and get them ready for the next day. We all got up early Friday and had our cars on the show field trying to beat the heat. That also gave us time to look around at all the nice Chevelles, and visit with the vendors. While visiting with this one particular vendor, we found out he knew everything there is to know about wheels and tires for Chevelles. He was quite the guy to talk to. Ed gave him the nickname "The Wheel Wizard." He did sell Ed a set of wheels and tires and had me really close to buying a set of 18" wheels and tires for my car, but I fought off the temptation and got out of there without spending any money. Friday night Detroit Speed put on the autocross race, and after seeing what they could do to a Chevelle suspension last year, I decided I needed to take advantage of the opportunity and take my car out on the track and see what it could do. The autocross was set up in the drag strip parking lot, and never being there before, I didn't know the way. I saw the Detroit speed car leave, so I pulled in right behind him and thought I would just follow him there. It was a good idea until I got on the winding road that leads you to the drag strip. It is like going down on a back road to the Lake of the Ozarks. I didn't realize the race started once we got on this road, and before you know it he was gone and I couldn't keep up. I drove right past the turn off, and four miles later I figured I missed it and went back and found the road to the drag strip.

Then we walked the track with the Detroit Speed guys; they give you some advice on how to maneuver around the track. I have to admit, it was a blast. Waiting in line for the second lap, there were two girls in front of me and they said it was their first time at the autocross. for reminding me of this, ALL NIGNT LONG. Not wanting to be out done by two girls, I just had to see if I could beat their times, and I have to admit there was no way. I found out later that one of those girl's brother owns Detroit Speed and he built the car for her. She also had a 500 HP motor in the car. That made me feel a little bit better. I thought that was fast until I saw the driver for Detroit Speed Chevelle run the course, and he was running it under 28 seconds. All in all, I had a great time and nothing broke on my car. The next day was pretty much the same schedule, and at 2:00 awards started in the tent that they have set up. 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
