#### **President's Column**

Hello MACC Members,

Camaro not a Chevelle? Have you ever wondered why GM picked a Camaro to re-enter the muscle car field five years ago instead of a Chevelle? For me, growing up I was a fan of the Chevelle more so than the Camaro. My first love was the Corvette, but I knew my dad wouldn't ever let me have one, and I couldn't ever afford one of these legendary vehicles either, so I shifted my interest to the Chevelle. I can remember my mom reading in the newspaper that Chevrolet was coming out with a new mid-size car called the

Chevelle. I was 13 at the time, and I knew that was going to be the car I wanted. Sure enough, my grandparents and my uncle bought one in 1964. Then in 1966, my cousin Jerry bought a new Mailbu. By 1967 I was 16, and my dad let me buy a brand new 67 Malibu, it had a 283- 3 speed on the tree.

In 1966 Chevrolet came out with the Camaro to

compete with the Mustang. The muscle car wars were on at that time. Everyone was building bigger motors and faster cars, but for me no one could compare with the styling of the Chevelle. The Camaro was turning big numbers in production and it was changing every year. There where RS, SS, Z28, and even plain Jane Camaros. They used every gimmick in the book to beat the Mustang. But the Chevelle sales where always strong year after year, and they would out produce and outperform the completion. Finally, GM






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noticed how popular the Chevelle was in the muscle car wars, outperforming the Ford's, and Mopar's. So, in 1970 Chevrolet came out with the most popular Chevelle ever built. They knew this was the last year they could build a true muscle car because of government regulations and pressure from the insurance companies. They sold a ton of the SS396-350hp cars, and even built few with 396-375hp engine. Then in January they came out with the SS454's. 360hp was standard engine, but you could get the famous LS6. A 450hp engine was unheard of in those days, and this car was scary fast. To this day it is the most sought after Chevelle ever built. The innovations that GM put in this car had never been seen in a Chevelle before. From the hood stripes, to the cowl induction, the styling of the 1970 seemed to be timeless. Now I know some of you two head light guys might argue some of these points, but the facts don't lie about this year of Chevelle. Never again could you get a 450hp engine in a Chevelle. Even the 71's and 72's where riding the coattails of popularity of the 70. With smaller motors, less horsepower, and two less headlights, these Chevelles where still very popular. It was the last chance to be a part of the muscle car era.

What would have happened if GM would have picked the 70 Chevelle instead of the 69 Camaro to restyle? I guess we will never know, but I think it would have been a bigger hit myself. However, I am a bit prejudice to the 70 Chevelle, if you haven't figured that out by now.

So, where can you see some of the nicest Chevelles ever produced by Chevrolet? At the 10<sup>th</sup> Annual "ACES" Mid America Chevelle Regional Car Show in Olathe, Kansas at the Great Mall of the Great Plains. September 23-24. Come by and let me know what you think.
