September 2011 Meeting Minutes

Mid-America Chevelle Club September 29, 2011

The September, 2011 meeting was called to order by Chair Roger Verstraete at 7:00 p.m. New member, Gordon Gilpin, attended the meeting, and introduced himself. In turn, the attending members introduced themselves. The minutes of the August meeting were approved as presented in the newsletter.

The meeting focused on the 2011 Mid-America Regionals conducted on the past weekend. Mr. Verstraete thanked everyone for their efforts and recognized those who worked at all stations. It was reported the show went well and there were 145 cars participating.

Mr. Verstraete suggested looking at new venues for future shows due to the condition of the Great Mall.

Mr. Byfield suggested looking at increasing classes within the years (examples: stock, modified, etc.)

It was also suggested that next year's fliers include a picture of the 2011 show field.

Overall, the consensus of the attending members was favorable to the Mall site (due to food and restaurant facilities), but look at contingency locations.

Mr. Farley noted there were 25 trailers, another factor that must be considered in venues.

Another note was to include signage to the show field location and to list location of events within the field.

Mr. Hallouer provided the treasurer's report which included the most current listing of the show funds, and club general funds. It was noted there are 58 current members.

Next month's events were reviewed: Fall Color Tour, Lake of the Ozarks, October 21-23; Halloween Party at the Smoot's residence which will include a voluntary Chili Cook-Off, October 29; and Rev-it-Up fundraiser car show at Lawrence, KS on October 8. Future events include: Holiday Party, RC's in Martin City, December 10 at 6:00 p.m; Bring Your Own Mug, Hill residence, January 27, 2012, (January club meeting); Dinner at Tasso's, February 11, 2012 at 7:00 p.m.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:00 p.m.
