February 2012 Meeting Minutes

Mid-America Chevelle Club February 23, 2012 Minutes

The meeting was called to order by Chair Roger Verstraete at 7:00 p.m. Mr. Verstraete introduced visitor Darren White, student at his school. Mr. White was welcomed. Members introduced themselves.

The minutes of January 26, 2012 were approved as published in the newsletter.

Mr. Verstraete informed the members of an upcoming club picnic, scheduled for May 20, 2012. He indicated the event would begin with a tour at Dan Yuran's shop near Bonner Springs, then on to the picnic at Blackfoot Park, Shelter House near 90th and Monticello, Lenexa. 
