March 2012 Meeting Minutes

March 29, 2012 Meeting Minutes

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Chair Roger Verstraete at Old Shawnee Pizza with 33 in attendance. Two new members were introduced: Dave Shelton, 1966 El Camino and John Roudebush – 1967 Chevelle. Current members introduced themselves.

The minutes, as published in the newsletter, were approved.

It was reported as a decision of the Car Show Committee to leave the show at the Great Mall of the Great Plains, but to investigate a back-up location for sometime in the future. It was mentioned the location at I-35 and Johnson Drive could be a future location. It was also noted the plaque budget of \$600.00 and categories would remain the same. In addition, it was noted the car parking would include two (2) more rows and order of parking would change from last year and members would use of walkie-talkies for parking assistance. It was reported there would be no out-of-town flier mailings; adding e-mails to past participants would be used. It was noted fliers would be distributed to metro car shows. It was suggested the members wear matching car show t-shirts with lanyards. It was also noted the Poker Run prize money would remain the same. The members were also informed club member, Tally Hobbs, would be the D.J. for this year's show. In addition, the show would end at 3:30 p.m. with the awards ceremony following. The Friday night mixer/cook-out would remain, but no Saturday evening events. It was mentioned that the trailer parking would remain the same and noted the need for the RV to be staffed at all times. The members present agreed that cost overruns would be borne by the club. The members spoke briefly of the financial risks of the event.

The April club meeting will move back to Superior Chevrolet, if remodeling is completed. (*Editor's note: The April meeting will be held at Old Shawnee Pizza.*)

Members were reminded of the April elections – noting the same officers would be running – no others volunteered for positions.

Outings of the club were reviewed: April 15 – Aquarium at 9:45 a.m., lunch at noon at Panera Bread; May 20 – club picnic at Lake Lenexa; April 14 – RC Racing, vehicle dynamometer testing.

Rick Byfield mentioned the Magic Dragon Car Show at Bagnall Dam, scheduled for May 4-5, 2012, indicating he and several others would be attending.

Eugene Hallouer, Treasurer, was on vacation – Chair Verstraete overviewed the financial report.

With no further business, the meeting adjourned at 7:45 p.m.

Well worth the \$40 to find out if you had a condition that could be very detrimental to the power plant. The old dog (the '66 not Jim) barked the loudest (400 hp at the rear wheels with an estimated 470 hp at the crank). The only car the MC Racing crew had to break out the traction compound for so the tires wouldn't roast on the dyno drums. Mr. Yuran left the lean burning supercharged big block at the shop for some fine tuning. We'll get his numbers posted along with several others that plan to dyno their cars at a later date. Right: The crew at MC Racing treated us great, were happy to explain what they were doing and provide tuning tips.
















Project Cars
