President's Column

Summer is here and it is hot, as usual, in Kansas City. This morning I went out to mow my yard and I broke a sweat just starting the lawnmower. There was a group of members that went to the Springfield car show early this month, but several of us cancelled at the last minute because of the heat. From the reports, our members told me the attendance was down around 25% from last year. Unless you have air conditioning in your car it is hard traveling in ninety degree plus weather in our old cars. The long range forecast is to be hot and dry, hot and dry, which means not much action at the local cruise nights. Maybe if someone would have a car show under the lights at night, and start around 8pm they might have people there, just an idea.

One of the things I noticed in the last couple of years was how many new generation muscle cars there are at car shows and cruises. I have been a Corvette fan since I was a kid, and for the money it is the best sport car on the market. The new Camaro is another car I really like, and with all the hi-performance options and suspension packages it would be a neat car to drive. Even the new Mustang is a fantastic car and maybe the best muscle car on the market for the money. The biggest drawback besides the price of all these cars, in my opinion, is they all look alike to me. A 2006 Corvette looks just like a 2012 Corvette. At least back in the 60's and 70's they changed the body style of the cars every two to three years.

I have talked to some of the other car clubs in the area like the Corvette, Mustang, and Camaro car clubs. Even with that said, a lot of us are upgrading our cars with modern technology such as LS engines, five speed transmissions, four wheel disc brakes, and new suspension systems. They may just follow the trend and have their own version of the new generation of muscle cars included in their membership.
