### Vice President's Column

This month I've got a two- part column. The first part is a sad story of woe regarding me and my beloved Tahoe. The second is much more upbeat and is about a fun event that a few MACC members attended last weekend. So on to my sad, sad, story.

For the past 7 or 8 years, I've owned Chevrolet's bigger SUV, the Tahoe. I like the size of this "truck", and that, coupled with the four wheel drive, V8 power, and seating for 6 comfortably, makes this a great allaround vehicle for me. I can take the kids to school, tow trailers with it all day if needed, and then wash it off and take my better half out to dinner. My first Tahoe was an '02 with a 5.3ls engine. This truck proved almost indestructible for the time that I drove it, and I eventually had to put a transmission in it at 220,000 miles. Other than routine brake jobs and oil changes, that's all that truck ever needed. I have since passed that vehicle off to my oldest son, and he now drives it to college- going strong.

A couple of years ago, we decided I was due for a newer, nicer vehicle. My obvious choice was of course, the Tahoe again. I searched high and low to find the one that I wanted, and finally settled on a '07 LTZ with a 5.3 again. Boy, that LTZ package is nice- leather seats, 20" wheels, in-dash nav with a backup camera and loads of other goodies. The thing that I have always feared about these newer, nicer vehicles is that when all these great gizmos start to have issues, it looks like you need to be a rocket scientist to fix them. So far, all the high tech stuff has been holding up, but where I really felt let down was with the mechanical stuff. Right off it didn't seem that this newer version had as much pulling power as the old one, but that could be my imagination, too. One thing that I didn't imagine, however, was an audible "clicking" noise coming from the bell housing area. I crawled over, under, and around trying to find the source of the noise to no avail. I figured that eventually, whatever was making the noise would give up the ghost and I would finally put that clicking to rest. Well, it sure did present itself, and what it turned out to be wasn't good.

Turns out it was the flywheel! After searching for "Tahoe clicking noise" on youtube, I found out this is a fairly common problem with Chevrolet trucks with this power plant. Since this is a 4-wheel drive, to get at the flywheel, you remove: both drive shafts, the exhaust, the transfer case, the cross member, the transmission, and disconnect about 500 sensors along the way. All this to get to the 6 bolts that hold on the "flexplate", as it is called when coupled to an automatic. And around those 6 bolts that join it to the crank is where the problem lies. The center was broken out of the offending piece, and it flexing and banging around in there is what made the clicking noise. I imagine it wasn't far from coming out from under the truck in huge hunks on the highway. All this work adds up to the better part of a weekend, and shop guides show it to be a 10 hour or so job. At most rates around town, by doing it myself, I saved around a thousand bucks, but boy do I have the scrapes and bruises to show for it! And a word to the wise: If you are planning or doing an LS swap into your Chevelle from a Chevy truck- check the flywheel! That \$60 part is a lot easier to change on the stand. On a side-note, you might want to explore a GM replacement or upgrade- my \$60 parts store piece now makes a great ZING! sound every time I start the truck. Bonus!
