# **President's Column**

### Hi MACC,

I have some updates about the club this month that I need to share with all of you. All the planning we did this winter on the car show is in process. We have sent car show flyers to every one of the four participating Chevelle clubs. The Wichita Chevelle Club wanted some extra ones because they are involved in The Big Chill, a car show that is held in Wichita every winter. I have also been contacted by the Kansas City, Kansas Visitor Bureau about any help that they can provide in promoting the car show. We have also been in contact with the Legends/ Village West people about the upcoming events at the Legends. They are putting it on their website and letting the other business' at the Legends know what we are planning on doing and seeing if they want to be a part of the car show by sponsoring an award. Cabela's has put our car show on their upcoming events schedule. We are getting a lot of help from everyone in the area, which is really nice because we have never had this much cooperation at any of the other locations that we held the car show at. Eugene has checked with the city about permits and so forth and we did run into a situation that we didn't know about. In the state of Kansas we are not able to have beer at the car show without a special permit, and if we get this permit we would have to fence the area where the car show is held, unless the place you are having the car show at has a liquor license. Since Cabela's does not serve liquor we will not be able to have beer on site. We will be going over this topic at the meeting this month for discussion. This law just doesn't exist at the Legends, but statewide. Eugene said that the city said Kansas laws are outdated and change comes really slow in the state. Imagine that!!!

I have been in contact with the Heartland Chevelle Club about the upcoming Regional they are hosting in 2017. At first, they were going to have it at a local casino in their area. However, after committing to having it there they changed the rules and cost of having the car show there. They were going to charge them \$500.00 per day for use of the parking lot, and they had to guarantee that they would sell \$4,000.00 worth of food and guarantee to book a set amount of rooms to have it there. With these demands, as you can guess, they decided to change locations. That was the easy part, now they are looking for a different spot to have it at. They have narrowed it down to two locations, one at a shopping center and the other is at a Cabela's in the area.

This month we will be going over this year's budget like we did in March. For those of you that can't make all the meetings, we usually allow money for the spring picnic, the fall party at Ed's, and the Christmas party. If the club makes some money at the car show we usually use the extra money to help pay for all of the Christmas Party like we did last year.


