#### **President's Column**

Hi MACC,

As this car season is coming to a close, I have been looking back at all the events and places our club has gone to this year. We went to a lot of car shows, cruises, Historic Sites in Missouri, and even went to the drive-in together. Some of the highlights for me were, World of Wheels Car Show in February where 8 members had their car entered. That was the first time I have ever entered my car and hopefully I will have my convertible done by the time next year's show comes around so I can enter it. Revisiting the Missouri State Penitentiary in Jefferson City, Missouri in May was another favorite. That was the second time for me and Janet to go there, and we love learning about the history of our area and all the stories that have come out of the prison. Our club picnic at John and Phyllis Prouty's place in Raymore where we had a great turnout and the weather could have not been better. Then in August, Hot Alma Nights in Alma, Kansas. This old little town at the base of the Flint Hills turns into a huge car show and then a party later in the evening. It just amazes me how many cars that seem to come out of nowhere to fill this town with old cars. And the highlight for me was our car show, the 29th Annual Midwest Regional Car Show. Maybe it was because of all the planning the car show committee did the last two years, and how everything just kind of fell into place during the show. Our new location at Cabela's was great and the layout worked out perfect too. The weather was a little warm but the nice breeze during the day kept everyone cool in the shade. When the weather is nice usually you get a good turnout and this year we had a record turnout, 160 of the nicest Chevelles from the Midwest were there at the Legends.

Looking at all the numbers for the car show and where everyone came from, it was almost a 50/50 split from in town to out of town guests. There were 44 club members there with a total of 48 cars. Queen City Chevelle club from Springfield had 8 club members, Wichita Chevelle Club had 7 club members, Heartland Chevelle Club had 6 club members. Our newest Chevelle Club from Hannibal, the Loafers, had 11 club members there. We had 33 cars that were form Missouri, 19 out of Kansas, 8 out of Nebraska, 7 out of Iowa, 3 out of Illinois, and 1 out of Oklahoma. We had David Palmer out of Pearland, Texas. David had a 1968 300 Deluxe Chevelle that was so nice and very rare. Our long distance winner was Michael Merlo from Boca Raton, Florida. Michael had a beautiful 1969 SS396 convertible that won the Dean Call pick, and scored a 995 on the 1,000 point judging. Then there was Wayne and Vicki Finger from Powhatan KS, with their 1968 Chevelle. This car won best of show, and the Cabela's pick. This has to be one of the most unbelievable Chevelles in the country. This car looks like Chip Foose or David Kindig had designed and built this car.

With this being the first year that I have been involved with the club doing 1,000 point judging, I have to admit we planned for this more than any phase of the car show. With Kent Scott and his crew, and with the help of Ken Lee and his staff of judges from the Antique Automobile Club of America KC Regional Chapter it was a huge success. We had 17 cars go through the judging and they were very professional and all the feedback I got was great. This is a hard process to do because everyone thinks they have a perfect car or don't feel they got a fair report on their car. These guys are professional judges and I think they did a great job and I want to thank them for all their effort and time.

Like at every car show we put on, we get comments good and bad. I welcome these, that is how you get better. For the most part everyone was very positive and loved having it at Cabela's. I heard from several first-time participants that it was one of the best car shows they have ever been

to, and how well it was run and how friendly everyone was. That is a huge complement for our club and all of our members that were there and worked the car show. I kept getting asked when next year's car show will be, and I just told everyone that it is yet to be determined. I really want to thank everyone on the car show committee for all their time, effort, and commitment to the club. Also, I wanted to thank everyone that helped out during the show. This could not have been the success it was without everyone's help. Our goal from the beginning was to set the standard for all upcoming Regional's, and I think we surpassed that.

The 2016 Fall Color Tour was October 14-16th, and everyone had another great time. We got to tour many areas of route 66 that are still open and tour the scenic areas of Missouri. In total we drove 165 miles Saturday and stopped at several different places. One of the most unique places was called the Elbow Inn. This is now a BBQ and bar type establishment. As you can tell by the name, it is a small bar. It was originally the Munger Moss Motel on Route 66 and was built in the 1920's. When they changed the routing of Route 66 in the 1940's the hotel struggled to stay opened, and was sold and turned into a bar. Munger Moss Hotel relocated in Lebanon, MO and that is where we stayed Friday night. It was built in the 1940's and is still decorated in the same theme of the 1940's.

This year's Fall Party is going to be at a different location. Ed's house is being remodeled and won't be done in time for the party. John Freeman, owner of Midwestern Mechanical, has generously agreed to host this year's party and chili cook-off at his house in Hillsdale. We invite everyone to join us for some good eats and a warm fire. You can come any time after 4:30 and we will plan on eating at 6pm. Also take a minute and welcome back Shawn & Stacy from Spring Hill, KS. Shawn and Stacy were member from 2007-2008.


