MID-AMERICA CHEVELLE CLUB HENDRICK CHEVROLET, MERRIAM, KS June 29, 2017 MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Chair Verstraete. There were 23 persons present.

Chair Verstraete overviewed the recent "car events."
