








What beautiful horses these are. They are treated like Royalty.

# **Vice-President's Column**

Vintage Air wrap- up!

For those of you following along with my latest wrench- turning adventure, where we left of last installment was: Car disassembled, dash pulled, and likely never to be whole again. Have faith! I stuck with this one until the end, and actually completed a project. Gold star for me, and here's how it went.

Once the dash is out, all the modifications begin. The biggest change there has to do with the glove box. To make room for the new unit under the dash, you need to cut 2" off the back of the glove box. Not a big deal, and they supply a nice finish off plate for the back of it when done. Next up concerning the dash is to modify the existing vents to accept the new hoses- again with the supplied adapters. All went together well, and after tidying up some wiring behind the dash, it was ready to be re-installed.

The next step was to mount the new unit under the dash. It fits in there nicely, and they supply a nice block off plate for the huge hole in the firewall left by the original air box. All of the lines, both heater hose and A/C run through a round plate that is hidden behind the fender in the original location for the blower fan. This allows you to hide all of those supply lines if you are looking for the smooth firewall look. I ran the lines out and dropped them close to where they should go. After connecting the heater hoses, I assembled the A/C lines and oriented the ends how I wanted them. After marking the lines, I broke out a tool that was probably some of the smartest money that I've spent in a while. Instead of mocking up the A/C lines and pulling them off, taking them somewhere to be crimped, then wrestling them back into place, I decided that I should just buy the crimping tool. Bought this gem on Amazon for a fraction of what Vintage Air wanted, and man did it work sweet. It came with multiple sized dies for different sized lines, and made perfect crimps, which both function and look great. I don't have any idea how you would get those lines reinstalled through the access plate with the ends on, so thankfully, I didn't have to find out.









I mounted the compressor and related bracketry, as well as the condenser up front. After making the electrical connections and re-installing the dash, I was just about ready to roll- with the exception of the belts. This was a challenge that I didn't see coming! They can't tell you what belt you need, as most setups differ slightly. It seemed like a half dozen trips to the auto parts store and lots of fiddling and adjusting, but I finally got a pair of belts that fit just right and left me some adjustment. I properly tensioned the belts, vacuumed the system down, charged it up and voila! Ice cold air.



Got this all wrapped up just in time for a late summer cruise to La Vista, NE for the regionals, and I gave it a good test. The system performed flawlessly and worked like a champ. The only snag I ran into was installer error, I must not have torqued the long pivot bolt for the compressor well enough, as the nut was missing when I got to Nebraska and the bolt had worked almost all the way out. After searching out a suitable replacement nut (Thank you, Mr. Gragg) and reassembling the compressor mount, I was back in business with no further issues.

The long and the short of this project is this: I'm impressed. The kit was designed exactly for MY CAR, with no guesswork involved. That, coupled with some of the best instructions I've ever seen, and you've got a good product. Each section had it's own booklet, complete with pictures for those like me that need a little extra help. The install was not hard, but was time consuming, with install time in the 16-20 hour range. I don't mind it though, because to me time spent in the shop working on my old cars is rarely time wasted. I hope this answers a few questions for those of you





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looking for a few more creature comforts in your ride, and if I can clarify or answer anything for you, hit me up anytime!


