Project car update time!

As most of you know, I'm currently working on several projects at all times- both at work and at home. I find that it really helps break up the monotony of the day-to-day. Some folks are able to take on just one project at a time, and see it through to completion without starting another. I, however, always seem to take a bit of a different path. I like to start a project, promptly get bored, and then start another. At this point, I should have enough half-completed vehicles to last me until well past my centennial birthday.

One of the cars that I'm working on (or not working on) that folks are the most interested in is the 1969 Beaumont. This car is painted, frame done, and just begging for re-assembly. I don't know if anyone else ever gets bit with the in-decisive bug, but boy- have I got it on this one. I'm just about past the parts ordering stage, and once I have a pallet of nice, new parts sitting on the floor, we should see some real progress. Nothing new to report on this one this month, but hope to have some updates real soon.

True to my mode of operation, the most progress I've made recently is on...you guessed it....another new project car!

I've been sitting on a '68 Malibu for a while that Roger and I sniffed out in a barn out in Bonner Springs a few years back. It's largely been bouncing back and forth between my shop in Paola and a good buddy's house from work. He stripped back most of the paint from the car and fixed a bunch of the normal bodywork woes that they all have. When we got busy at work, we pushed it off to storage in a barn on some property that I own so that he could have his garage back. Well, the old barn is getting some updates (thanks, Tony D.!) so the car made its way back to our shop. Since it was more or less in the way, we decided we may as well crank away on it some more. Here's where we are at!







I actually had this car running originally, and it did run when we got it from the previous owner. That being said, the car never did move under its own power. A case of Dextron III later, the car drives! Come to find out, the Powerglide in this ride only holds its fluid for 24 hrs, before it turns your garage floor into a red, gooey mess. Along with that, the engine smoked bad enough to keep a 10 square mile radius mosquito-free. It became clear real quick that this non- numbers matching drivetrain had to go. After the guys at the shop got the anemic mill and slushbox out on the floor, I decided to decode the stamp on the block. Turns out it was coded as a 65-67 283 that was rated at just over 100 horsepower- no wonder this heavy ride didn't want to move. In its place, we put a 350/350 combo out of a '72 Monte Carlo parts car that I bought. We did treat the "new" engine to a Dupli-Color rebuild before we bolted it between the rails, so it should be good to go.



While up on the lift, we were standing under the car, and I reached up and grabbed one of the rear tires and gave it a little spin- and to my surprise, the other rear tire spun the same direction. We kind of looked at each other and decided to investigate a little further. There, still on the drain plug of the mighty 10 bolt rear end, was the plastic tag denoting the use of "Positraction Fluid Only". I scraped off the grime on the passenger axle tube and grabbed the code to find out what this was- code # FM 12 08 W, a 3:36 posi. While not as strong or desirable as its 12 bolt cousin, this 10 bolt will work fine behind this tame cruiser- and leave 2 stripes doing it!

While I was in the mood to de-code, I grabbed a pic of the trim tag, and found out that this car was built the 3rd week of December 1968 here in KC. Original color scheme was Y-2-- Butternut





Yellow with a black vinyl top. Nothing special, by any means, but still fun to see how this car was optioned out and what it should have looked like when new.



So, in the coming months, we'll keep plugging away at our budget-build '68. Keep an eye outone of these days, you may see a Butternut Yellow blur show up to a club event. Note that I said "one of these days"- while not mentioning what "year" those days may be in.


