Vice-President's Column

The results of last month's elections are in! Thanks to your overwhelming support, it looks like I get to keep my office for another season. And, as such, you are now stuck with another column from me...see what you've done? This month, I'm covering the riveting topic of ride height and suspension!





One thing that I had noticed over the last couple of years, was that somehow, the front end of my wagon was on the rise. While most things tend to settle and head south as they age, my front end seemed to do the opposite! The only logical explanation that I could come up with is that the sheer length of the land yacht caused the front to head north when the rear went south. Regardless, I wasn't interested in raising the rear, so the front had to come down. Here's how I remedied the look of the perpetual launch.



The easiest and most direct path, it seemed, was to replace the front springs with lowering springs. A quick call to CPP yielded what I thought I was looking for...springs that have an advertised lowering rate of 1.5". I had already replaced the worn front suspension pieces a couple years ago, so replacing the springs was pretty straightforward. One thing I did find, however, was that the front shocks were blown, and proceeded to spew oil all the floor when removed. Thankfully, I had a set of Hotchkis front shocks laying around, so I put them to use. Got the springs and shocks back together in record time, took it on a test drive to seat everything in, came back and looked at the car's profile, and.....it looked exactly the same. Apparently, a 1.5" drop spring sits about the same as a 40 year old worn out front spring. Go figure.









As luck would have it, I also had a new set of CPP 2" drop spindles on hand. In my quest to bring the nose down, back apart came the front end. Now, in the instructions, they specifically talk about not using drop spindles with lowering springs, but what the hey. Plus, this also gave me an opportunity to repack and inspect the wheel bearings. With everything back together and on the ground, a short time later it was time for the test drive. Drove fine, stopped fine, so next it was off to alignment. On paper, the modifications add up to a whopping 3.5 inches of drop. It got me pretty close to where I wanted it to be, with only minor clearance issues at full compression. That will be a fight for another day.



In retrospect, I think next time, I will probably opt for coil overs and save all the repeated disassembly/reassembly time. Food for thought for the next build!

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
