We have secured a new location for this year's Christmas party. We will be having it at the historic Thompson barn in Lenexa, Kansas at 112th and Lackman Road. We are renting the hall and having the dinner catered in. This year's date is on Friday night, December 6th. The main reason for moving is the Hollywood Casino doubled the price on using the banquet room. Here is some history of this historic barn.

The Lackman-Thompson estate was once home to Margaretha and William Lackman, German immigrants who came to America in 1885. The Lackmans sold their estate to Kansas City horse and mule dealer Frank Thompson in 1908.

In 1932, the farm's original barn burned down, which gave Thompson the opportunity to build a new brick barn – the barn that still stands today. The Thompsons' son, Hugh, sold much of their estate to be developed into Southlake Business Park and bequeathed the remaining land to the Johnson County Community College Foundation.

The Lackman-Thompson Estate was placed on the Register for Historic Kansas Places – the only structure in Lenexa to receive the honor. In 1996, the JCCC Foundation offered the property to the City of Lenexa to preserve it and put it to good public use. We worked with many partners, including the Kansas State Historical Society, to honor the agreement.

The original Lackman house now serves as the home of the Lenexa Chamber of Commerce, Convention & Visitor's Bureau and Economic Development Office. We restored the barn, preserving its historical character and blending it into a new era.

Vice-President's Column

VP's Corner....with Ed Smoot

I'm sure everyone reading this column that has had a classic car of any brand at any time can relate to this month's column. Had a great Saturday with a pretty good sized group of MACC members. We took a trip to Aeromotive- a local manufacturer of fuel systems and tanks that provide a wide array of products from simple tanks and pumps to high end racing pumps and equipment that can supply enough fuel to fill a fire hose at full force if needed. The private tour was awesome and very informative-- started with complimentary donuts and coffee and Jackson & Johnson (PR and Sales, respectively) came in on their day off to show us the ins and outs of how their operation came to be and runs today. Very impressive, and these guys really knew their stuff. So impressive, in fact, that I signed up and bought one of their new Gen II fuel tanks / systems on the spot for the Beaumont that I'm building. If you are in the market for a new fuel tank with an in-tank pump or need a fuel supply for a swap of any kind or a hi-horsepower application, give these guys a call or visit Aeromotive.com. They will sell direct and you can pick up product right there in Lenexa- saves a ton in freight on those big items.

That was great, but I also used this as an opportunity to break out the Butternut '68 for it's big debut. Keep in mind that I haven't driven this car more than a couple of miles since I acquired it a few years ago. So what could go wrong? Oh, let me count the ways...

The small stuff- they were calling for the possibility of rain that day, so I thought that I should try the wipers. The previous owner had obviously opted to not use any kind of knob on the switch and went the pliers route during his ownership. I followed suit, and lo and behold, they came on! The not so great thing is that when they turned off, they did so on their own timetable, and parked sticking straight up. No big deal, but a project for another day.



More small stuff- the glove box would not stay shut, so it lives its life open for now. The crank for the driver window won't stay on, and can usually be found under the driver seat when you need it. No defrost, radio, or any of those creature comforts- but I did take the time to fix the taillights and turn signals last week, so at least there's that.





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The big stuff: I noticed while I was cruising to the meet up spot that whenever I let off the accelerator, the car sure slowed at a rapid rate. Hmmm- a little concerning, but when I stopped for fuel, I felt the hubs at each corner and none seemed hot. Well, that sure changed once I hit KC traffic! I started smelling something when I was about 10 minutes out, but had to press on. When I got to the Aeromotive parking lot, there was a nice wisp of smoke coming from the rear brake drums. Not much I could do at the time, so I just let it cool down while we did our tour and then went to lunch afterwards. On the trip home, same result- but a pretty marked increase in brake drum plumage. On a positive note, I now didn't have to worry about what I was going to be doing this Saturday afternoon- it was brakes! Old cars have a way of helping you with those kinds of decisions.



I pulled the rear wheels off and found the rear shoes slightly extended. Once I released the pressure on the bleeders, they went right back in. Of course the shoes were smoked, but I had isolated the problem. I had this happen on my son's '68 el Camino- it was the rear brake hose. It was acting as a one-way trap door due to it's age. The inside of the hose had collapsed internally and wouldn't allow fluid back to the master cylinder. A quick trip to the parts store confirmed that NOBODY keeps a rear brake hose for a 68-72 Chevelle on the shelf- what gives?

Discouraged, I returned home, and did the next logical thing- started another upgrade. I yanked the non-power booster off of the firewall and swapped the system over to a vacuum assist booster/ master that I had sitting on the shelf from another Right Stuff upgrade on another car. To test things when done, I capped the rear line, bled the rest of the system, and took her for a spin.





We've got brakes again! And they are so much easier on the right leg-- good move on my part. The added bonus with no back brakes- I can be my own line lock! Burnouts became effortless- I was like a 16 year old kid again. Now, once the brake hose comes in, I can complete my brake repair and call this part of the project done...for now...and move on to the other dozen things that happen when you start to daily drive a 51-year-old beater.



I won't make this month's meeting, so you all stay safe and we'll see you at the next gathering!
