



President's Column

Hi MACC,

My passion for cars started at an early age. I was raised on a truck farm and started driving tractors and trucks at the age of 10-11 years old. At age 14 when I got my learning permit, my grandpa and I would deliver produce to the local grocery stores and the city market. When I turned 16, my dad said I could use the family's 1951 Chevy dump truck any time I wanted. I think my Dad was trying to be funny, but when I cleaned it up and started driving it on Sunday afternoons he decided it was time for me to get my own car. In July of 1967, my dad and I went down to Ed Roberts Chevrolet in Bonner Springs to pick up my new Malibu. I paid \$2,400 cash for that Chevelle with a 283, 3 on the tree car. I had saved up the money to pay cash for it at age 16. I can remember walking out of the show room floor with the keys in hand when Ed Roberts came up to us and introduced himself. He wanted to give me some advice about my first new car. He said to me, the first clutch was on him and the second clutch was on me. Luckily, that Malibu must have had a heavy duty clutch because it never went out.

After graduating high school and swearing I would never ever work on the farm again, I got into the Sheet Metal Apprentice program and never looked back. At age 19, it was time for an upgrade in Chevelles. This time I went down to Ed Roberts Chevrolet and ordered a red 1970 SS 396 on my own. I was still living at home at the time and when I got back I told my parents that I ordered a new Chevelle. After watching me change this and that on my 67 my dad knew I was up to no good and asked me what engine does that SS car have? Being as honest as I could be, I told him I just got the stock one that comes on the Super Sport package. To my surprise that's all he said, but I think he knew better.





After many years of helping the city of Shawnee keep a fresh coat of rubber on the streets, I got married to Janet and decided it was time to start acting like an adult. I sold the 70. We bought a new Monte Carlo in 1972 that Janet drove, and I bought an old truck to drive. Well that old truck didn't last long and before I knew it there was another 70 setting in my drive way. It was even faster than my first SS.

In the late 80's and early 90's when the muscle car era started back up, the urge to own another Chevelle bit me again. This time I decided I try to make a buck or two and buy and sell some Chevelles. Since I had owned several when I was younger, I figured I knew what I was doing, and I thought it could be profitable too. Well after buying two 64's, one 65 and one 69 SS396, I determined I really didn't know as much as I thought. After buying and selling these four cars I think I broke even at best. Since I was 16, I have owned 11 Chevelles and one 1975 SS El Camino.

In 1998, I started looking for my next Chevelle. I found a red 70 SS396 just like the one I owned in 1970. Two days later it was setting in my garage and I was a proud owner of a Chevelle again. My plans were to keep this car and just enjoy it and go to some car shows and cruise. At one of the first car shows I went to I was next to a guy who had a red 66 SS 396 Chevelle and his name was Rocky Hill. He told me he belonged to the Mid America Chevelle Club. Not knowing there was a Chevelle Club in Kansas City, I was interested on what they did and where they had their meetings at. Rocky explained to me what the club did and that the next year the club was hosting a Chevelle Regional at the Double Tree Hotel in Overland Park and that I should make a point to come. So I took his advice and went to my first Chevelle Car show. I must admit, I had a blast seeing all the Chevelles from the past. Then the next year I also attend the Chevelle show at the Olathe Great Plains Mall. I hadn't joined the club at that time. I had a lot going on and then and I had some serious health issues. My Chevelle set for about 5 years without much attention. I was recovering from cancer and then after that Janet and I remodeled a house in Olathe. In 2008, Janet and I sold the house from hell and bought a new home in western Shawnee. Now with all my free time, it was time to start paying attention to my 70 again. This time I joined the Mid America Chevelle Club. I was never much of a mechanic and to be honest I'm still not very good but I figured it was time to at least try my hand at it. I needed to know more about how to work on my car, have a resource for information, where to get parts and how to make my car more reliable. When I went to my first meeting, I saw a familiar face, Rocky Hill. Rocky was the president of the club and he was the only one I knew of at the meeting. He kept talking to this Rick guy about this and that and when it was time for introductions; Rick asked me if my car was red. I thought that was kind of weird question to ask but I was new to the club and found out later he always asks every new members that question. Why I don't know, maybe he just wants to own a red 70 someday? Then another guy by the name of Dan would talk about the upcoming Chevelle car show. Later I found out that Dan had a metal building full of Chevelles and parts. Dan was a legend in the Chevelle world and the stories only grew every time someone started talking about him.

Over the years Dan Yuran had become one of my best friends. He has taught me more about working on Chevelles than anyone could have. I always admired his cars and was amazed how nice a rusty old piece of metal could be turned into a piece of art. Several years ago, I was able to get one of Dan's project cars from him. It was my goal to try making it as nice as if Dan himself had restored it. Dan's health has been a real issue for him and his family the last few years. I really miss going out to his metal building and seeing all his cars and hearing all the stories he use to tell us about ever car he owned and he owned a lot of Chevelles.





Then in 2010, I became president of the club and Ed Smoot became our VP. It was one of our goals for the club to be a resource for any member to help them in any small way we could so they could keep their cars on the road and give advice on restoring their Chevelle. Another goal was to promote the club in any way we could, get the word out that there is a Chevelle Club in the Kansas City area and that we host a Chevelle Car show every year. In doing this, we believed we could increase the club membership. In 2010 we had 44 paid members and this year we are up to 92. I like to believe what we are doing is working and I believe it is, but the real reason, in my opinion, is its membership. I see every month at our meetings how attendance is up and all the friendships being built amongst our members. The attendance at all the events that the club participates in is up over the years. We have a great group of people who just happen to own a Chevelle or in Steve Calder's case a GMC Sprint. So I hope all the current members will keep this in mind when it times to renew your membership. We want to keep promoting the club and help the next generation of Chevelle owners to be enthusiasts too.

This month's election of club officers and club dues are due at the end of the month. Dues are \$35.00 per year. Personally, I don't like to talk about money and dues but I feel it's my responsibility to the membership and also to keep everyone informed where the club's money is being spent. Our goal financially, is to break even each year and have a really nice Christmas Party at the end of the year. Our attendance at the Christmas Party over the last three years has been around 70 people. Any money made at the car show is put toward paying for this event. Dues money is used to pay the club insurance, overhead and events the club sponsors throughout the year.

Over the last month we have had two members, Jeff Long and Mike Stites both lose their fathers. I speak for everyone in the club in saying we are all sorry for their loss and our prayers go out to them and their families. Also, Eugene's wife, Anna, was in a really bad motorcycle accident last week. Anna broke her leg in several places and her ankle too. We are all hoping for a speedy recovery for her.

Well I hope to see everyone at this month's meeting and at our First Friday Night Cruise In on May 3rd at Jim and Julie Stacks garage at the Carriage House garages in DeSoto, Kansas. Check your email, because you don't want to miss our first cruise in of the year.


