VP's Corner.....with Ed Smoot

Getting ready for a road trip in your classic car can sometimes be a bit of a job, but I enjoy a challenge, and it gives me good reason to get some of those nagging little tasks completed.

Such was my story a short couple of days prior to our annual MACC pilgrimage to Hannibal, MO to see The Loafers car club and attend their awesome show. I decided to once again take my '72 Wagon on this journey, so I figured some attention to my trusty ride was in order.

I had noticed that my brake pedal had been a little spongy over the last year, and no amount of bleeding was helping the situation. So, off came the master cylinder, and in it's place went what I am sure is one of the finest reman units that O'reilly Auto Parts could muster. The install went fine, everything bled out well, and my pedal was restored- cross one job off the list!

Next up was my pesky dash temp gauge that was insistent on telling me that the engine was running right around 250 degrees, regardless of what I did. To remedy this, I ordered a new sender and installed it along with a fresh splash of coolant to replace what I lost in the swap. Fired the 'ol dog up, took it for a spin, and sure enough...still 250 degrees on the guage. Now before everyone gets all worked up about melting pistons and the like, I do have a digital guage





built into the controller for my fuel injection and it confirmed my suspicions. Engine runs at about 187 degrees with the air on, and my 50 year old dash was just fibbing to me. Oh well- job for another day.

The big add that I made for this trip was something that I've wanted for a long time, cruise control. I do a lot of highway driving, and cruise is just one of those creature comforts that I like to have. I ordered up the Dakota Digital kit from Summit racing, and it showed up in plenty of time. The install is very straight forward- mount the servo, connect the cable to the throttle and wire the thing in. I bought the correct transmission adapter that screws right on where the speedo cable goes, and everything went together nicely. I opted for the somewhat-correct-looking stick that replaces the turn signal lever, and that was probably the most tedious part of the install. Pull the steering wheel, disassemble the turn signal canceller, and fish the wiring harness through the steering column to hide the wires. Once done, I put everything back together and was ready to take it for a spin. Right off when I hit the highway, I engaged the cruise and set it at 65 for a test. It held it for a mile or so, then started to climb. 70, 75, 80, 85 and that's where I shut it off. Back to the shop and a couple calls into Dakota Digital, and they aren't quite sure what's wrong yet. Out of time, I decided to run without it for this trip, but did play with it some on the highway. It worked a solid 30% of the time, so I'll have to continue on at a later date to exorcise the demons in that part...I'll keep you posted.









The trip to Hannibal was great, other that our lunch stop on the way turned into a several hour debacle regarding an LS valve spring for our friend Rick Byfield. This unfortunately ended his trip, but we did pretty much make friends with everyone in that small town, and even had a guy bring over his '72 Nomad Wagon for us to see. Cool guy, and I think he enjoyed seeing the Graggs wagon and mine and comparing notes.

The next day on the show field was damp to say the least, but I was really surprised at the turnout that the show still had even with the sketchy weather. The skies cleared some towards the end of the day, and we all headed home without incident. If you've never been to Hannibal, MO for that show or just to visit, be sure to put it on your list...you won't be disappointed!




