It's late August and like every year, the car show season is coming to an end in about 6 weeks. Starting this Friday night, Wellsville, Kansas will be having their annual Friday night car show. Its starts at 4pm and they usually have a large crowd there. Check out our Facebook page and commit if you are coming. Clayton Neil will be saving us a certain number of parking places so we all can park together.

On Friday, September 6th, our first Friday Night Cruise-in will be at Russ and Vicky Peters house. Steve will send out an email with time and address to their home. They are providing chicken wings and we are asking members to bring a side dish or dessert.

On Saturday, September 7th, Johnson County Old Settlers Classic Auto Show will be held at 100 E Santa Fe St, Olathe Kansas from 9am to 3pm.

On Sunday, September 8th, the World of Wheels Car Show will be held at Old Shawnee Town in Shawnee, Kansas. Old Shawnee Town is located at Herman Laird Park at Johnson Dr and Cody. The car show starts at noon and runs to 4pm.

On September 14th, the city of Merriam is hosting the Turkey Creek car show. John Freeman from Midwestern Mechanical will be running the show like he always does. This is one of my favorite car shows of the year. If you haven't ever been to this show you need to put it on your schedule to attend. Last year we had around 20 club members in attendance. The Merriam City Market area will fill up fast so plan on leaving early. There were about 300 cars there last year and the city is planning for a record turnout this year. This is the only car show I know of that gives out a \$4,000 prize that can be redeemed at any of their Gold Sponsor's place of business. This is also the same weekend that Lin Dan automotive is having there open house at their shop in Merriam. Hope as many club members as possible can come and join us for this year's show. John Freeman will be at this month's meeting to give more details about the car show and where the best place to meet is so we can enter at the same time.

The next big car show is in Ottawa, Kansas on September 20th and 21st. Ol'Marris River Run car show has a long history of putting on this huge car show every year. Expect to see over 2,000 cars there Saturday and Sunday. They have a great city park to have it at and there is all the shade

you could ever want for a car show. They have raised their prices on this year's car show to \$30 for pre-registration and \$40.00 the day of the show. They are also putting restrictions on what kind of vehicles are allowed in. Personally, I think they are trying to get rid of all the old junky cars that tend to show up for this show.

The following weekend is our car show. The schedule for this year's show is the same as in past years. We will open registration from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Friday. At 5:30 the Cruise and Poker Run will start. Jon Clark and Kent will be running this event this year. If you want to help in this event, please contact them at this month's meeting or on the day of the show. After the poker run/cruise we will be having our annual Friday night cookout. That will start at 6:30. We are asking members to bring a side dish or a dessert to go along with the meat the club is providing. If you would like to help cook or help serve food you can contact Ed or me. The Friday night cookout is a way the club shows its appreciation for our out of town guests coming to our show. If you can't bring your car to the car show but want to come by for the Friday night cookout please feel free to do so. Then on Saturday, the car show will resume at 8am and will run until 3:30pm. After that it will be time for awards. At this month's meeting, I will be going over all the details of this year's show. If you want to help out in any way, please feel free to talk to Ed or me about that. We always want to include as many members as we can in the car show and appreciate all the help we can get. This is the club's biggest event of the year and we are asking all club members, if possible, attend this year's car show. The more cars there the better it is for everyone involved.

In our best year we had 160 Chevelles, El Caminos, and Sprints there. It would be great to beat that record again. So, with all these great car shows and cruises coming we need to make an effort to pass out our car show flyers. This is still the best way to get the word out about our club and car show. I still have a good supply of flyers and will have them on hand at this month's meeting. Brian has included this year's car show flyer with registration on the back. The car show shirts won't last long, so in order to get one in the size you want you need to send in your registration ASAP. We have ordered more than normal, but I have a feeling they will go fast. This year car show will be in the same shopping center as last year, Village West/Legends in Kansas City, Kansas. This year's show will be held in the Nebraska Furniture Mart parking lot. Just across the street from the Sporting Kansas City Soccer Complex. We have had conversations with Nebraska Furniture Mart about wanting to have our car show in the same location for as long as we can and stop moving it around to different locations every few years. They have shown a great interest in providing us with that in mind too. They want a car show in there parking lot every year to help draw new customers into the business. We believe this new location will draw a lot of interest and foot traffic for the car show and for Nebraska Furniture Mart. We are always working to keep our name out there to the public to let them know there is a local Chevelle Club in the Kansas City area. I can't tell you how many people I've run into since belonging to MACC that didn't know there was a Chevelle Club. VP's Corner.....with Ed Smoot

Well, it's that time of year again. You guessed it- time for the Show Me Rally!

This event has grown by leaps and bounds since its inception 3 years ago. The first rally had 8 teams, the 2nd year they had 16 teams, and this year they capped it at 40 teams! That's some serious growth, and I believe its attributed to the word getting out about the amount of fun that we have.

This year, I decided to ramp up the fun factor in regards to my ride. I purchased a retired 2015 Charger Pursuit police car at the Purple Wave auction earlier this year. It's a Hemi car with a 5.7 in it with 170k on the clock. I got it cheap enough that it wouldn't bother me terribly if it got crashed or impounded, so I say let's do this!

I started by ditching the cop springs and suspension and lowering the car a couple inches all the way around. I threw a set of Challenger 20" wheels on it that I had from another project and added some new rubber. I scored the correct push bar for the front off Craigslist for \$50, and added back in the flashing LED lights front and rear. As far as engine mods go, we threw on a cold air intake, upgraded the exhaust, and installed our ace in the hole... a 150 shot from our friends at Nitrous Outlet. All that was left now was to pray that it would not explode over the 4 day run!



On launch day, I decided that we needed to make an entrance to let the other teams know exactly what they were dealing with. My co-pilot and myself donned police t-shirts, mustaches, and reflective shades and rolled into the kick off party with the lights going- everyone loved it! It was great to see old friends from last year and meet the new crews- before we knew it, it was time to blast off!






