2020 Meeting Minutes

MID-AMERICA CHEVELLE CLUB HENDRICK CHEVROLET, MERRIAM, KS January 30, 2020 MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Chair Verstraete. There were 36 persons present.

Mr. Verstraete discussed new business. It was reported the Car Show Committee met before Thanksgiving and noted that Lynn LeCount has drafted the Midwest Regional Car Show Flier. A changed noted in this year will be having club participation voting for he special awards with the exception of Dean Call's pick and the Sponsor's pick. The cars will be judged per year, with no breakdown in classes and an additional 36 honorable mention awards. The show will be for two full days and a catered dinner. Additional items will be the same as for the 2016 show. Pre-registration will be required for the 1000 point judging.

Mr. Smoot detailed the on-line payments/credit card options which is in process. He noted there will be a \$2.00 transaction fee. He indicated this process can be used for various club events.

President's Column

Hi MACC,

During the winter time, I like to take on a project on one of my two Chevelles. Even after I was finished restoring my convertible, which took about two years and kept me busy most of the time, there were some bugs to work out that were challenging at times. Last year I decided to start paying some more attention to my red hard top. I did some things like putting wheels and tires on it and had a few repairs that needed to be done. There were some issues that required me to pull the dash, so I waited until this winter to attack them. I needed a new circuit board, the speedometer cable was broke and the dash lights were so dull you could not see the gages at night. Pulling the dash is not my favorite think to do put it had to be done. I figured while it was out it was a good time to add A/C. I have been thinking about doing this for about two years and this was the perfect time to tackle that project.

So I got online and ordered my Vintage Air unit and in three days it was here. Three big boxes showed up and right then I knew this was going to be a big project. I knew very little about installing A/C in a 50 year old car other than talking to Ed about it when he installed this system in his wagon. I was just hoping the directions were very clear. Well, I have to admit the directions were right on and it took you step by step on how to do it. First big think was taking out the dash and Eugene came over and helped me with that. This is a two man job to get it out and unhook all the wires and grounds.







As you can see it looks like a rat's nest after taking out the dash and exposing all the wiring. Next step is taking out the old heater box and controls and removing the blower fan and plenum on the engine side of the firewall. None of this is hard, it's just time consuming.

After reading the directions thoroughly, no where does it say it helps to have some body work experience. The last thing I thought I would have to do is take out the inner fender well so you can run the A/C lines and heater hose between the fenders. You also need this access to run these lines into the cabin of the car. Another thing they don't tell is you will lose your Astro ventilation because the fresh air vents are now used for the A/C vents and the floor vents are where the A/C lines come through at. This is what my 50 year old inner fender looked like.



The inner fender well must have been taken out when the car was painted over 25 years ago because it was missing about 5 bolts that held it in place. As you can see, it looks pretty rough. After a visit to the car wash and a can of brake cleaner, it was clean but in dire need of some paint. A coat of POR15 to address the rust and then about 3 coats of spray paint it looks way better and was ready to reinstall when needed. The bolts that were holding it into place on the





fender were mismatched and rusty. So I ordered new ones and this was one of the best decisions I made and made it a lot easier to reinstall with the correct bolts and nuts.



Here is a picture of the new air handling unit that fits under the dash. You also can see the A/C line stub into the cabin area. These lines have to be installed before installing this unit. This was just a test fit to make sure the unit would fit and to make sure all the holes needed were in the right place for mounting.



This is a picture of the new steel plate that mounts on the fire wall to cover the holes that are not needed, but also to give support to the fire wall to mount the new air handling unit in the cabin area. You can also see the inner fender well is out and the A/C and heater hose hanging in the engine bay.







This picture shows the inner fender well reinstalled and how the A/C and heater hose are hidden between the fenders. Like most projects when working on 50 year old cars, you always run into issues that you had not planned on. This project was just like that. I ran into some rust behind the inner fender on the core support and under some braces on the front end. I did a lot of painting and replacing of old rusty bolts that must have been original to the car. These are common issues that needed to be addressed. I always try to fix what I can when I run into these kinds of problems.
