#### **Vice-President's Column**

General Ed Smoot craziness, and Show Me Rally Recap!

Let's pick up where we left off, 3 days prior to blast- off for the Show Me Rally to Minnesota. We were clicking right along, knocking out small details leading up to the kick-off party on Thursday 7/30. We got the call that our tuner could see the car one last time on Wednesday, give us one final tune for maximum HP, and we'd be ready to roll. Dropped the car off in the morning with our friends at Modified By KC, and waited anxiuosly for their call. Well, that call came, but it sure wasn't the one that we wanted. While on the dyno, they were mid-pull when...BANG! the driveshaft twisted in half, ripping my nice Magnaflow exhaust off with it. Now, we were in a pickle. Where, in KC, can you have a full custom driveshaft made that will handle 5-600 horsepower in just a matter of hours? After everyone including the several branches of the name brand driveshaft place here in town said "sorry, pal", I found the guy that will be my go-to for all things driveshaft now. North Manufacturing not only stopped what he was doing to help us, but also let us watch as he made our new shaft (that he says we can't break) from scratch. Super nice guy, and he's earned my business! Ran our new shaft back to MKC, they stayed late to finish our tune, we loaded up the car and headed home.











The next day (the first day of the rally), I met my exhaust guy at his shop in Paola - Muffler Martat 5am. He came in early, hand built me an exhaust, and had me out of there in an hour so that I could finish loading and book it to the kickoff party at Worth Harley Davidson by 9. We made it, and it was sure nice to see a bunch of friendly faces. We rolled in in full Talladega Nights costume, and the whole package was a big hit. We were gunning for the "Most Creative Team" award, and although there was some stiff competition this year, we pulled it off! Team "Shake and Bake" graciously accepted our prize, enjoyed the kickoff festivities, and all headed north towards Minnesota and our first checkpoint. Fueled up at checkpoint 1, got our marching orders, and split up into groups depending on speed/comfort level. We all took off in our respective groups as planned-little did I know then that this was the last time we would see the anyone from the rally until we hit the hotel parking lot.







What we didn't know at the time is that when the driveshaft grenaded on the dyno, it had knocked the bushing out of the tailshaft of the trans that locates the slip yoke of the driveshaft and holds everything centered. Shortly after leaving checkpoint 1, the seal blew out of the rear of the trans. We pulled over amidst a cloud of smoke, and limped to a little parts store in Lamoni, Iowa, where they were nice enough to sell us ramps, tools we were missing, and run to another store an hour away to get us another seal. Of course, it rained heavily while repairing the seal, and for the rest of our trip north. We made it to the hotel parking lot, and promptly blew the hi side power steering line off while backing into our spot. We were ready to be done for the night, so we cracked a cold one (courtesy of Brian Findley- who made it there just fine hours earlier), and decided to tackle our woes in the morning.





Day 2 started off with a power steering line repair, and, with the help of local car guy Stan Shinker, we found a trans shop that had the tail housing we needed. They were kind enough to meet us at their shop mid-day, and let us change the part in the street outside their shop. A few gallons of fluid running down the street later, and we had our new (to us) housing installed, and life was good. Back to the hotel for a quick shower, some lunch, and we met up with the group to head out for some afternoon go-kart fun. We headed out easily enough, and just as I was stepping down on it to get





onto the highway, our plastic O'Reilly power steering pulley decided it no longer wanted to be part of the accessory drive. Due to late afternoon traffic, we opted to call for a wrecker, and took the ride of shame to the closest O'Reilly auto to replace said pulley, pump, and put everything back together. The locals were quite enamored with the car, and stopped (repeatedly) to shoot the breeze and see what we were doing.
