

#### **President's Column**

#### Hi MACC,

It's late October and usually we are winding down with club activates this time of year. With the Christmas Party being the last event of the year (and my favorite event) it is time to celebrate everything we did in 2020. The Christmas Party was always a blast and is always well attended. Last year's Christmas Party at the Thompson Barn was our best Christmas party the club has ever had. Limiting attendance to 45 people just wasn't going to work plus all the other requirements. I did check into several other places that we used before and the main question they all ask was how many in attendance? There is no way to give an





answer in this type of environment we are in right now. So, I cancelled this year's event with great regret. It's just not worth the risk of someone getting sick.

For the last 5 years, our club has been attending World of Wheels Car show. We usually have 8 cars there and have a great space and we always draw a crowd around our cars. We usually get several people to join the club at the show. This year's dates are February 26-28. This year, club participation is up in the air because no one knows how bad the Covid virus will be in late February. If anyone is interested in going you need to let us know by the first of the year so we can make plans for those who are going. We need 8 cars to get our usual spot. If we can't get 8 cars committed and you want to still attend, you will be on your own to make arrangements.

For those of you that attend our club meeting on a regular basis, you know we have been moving around to different locations. January and February meetings were held at Hendricks Chevrolet and then when everyone was aware of the Covid 19 virus we cancelled March and April meetings. For the last few months, we have been having them at the Merriam Market Place in downtown Merriam and the meetings have been outdoors. With the weather getting colder and daylight getting shorter the October meeting is being cancelled. I went over last month some of the year end topics and think we have everything covered for the rest of this year. As far as starting up meetings next year, we will just have to wait and see what the New Year brings.

This year was supposed to be our year to host the Mid-West Regional Chevelle Car Show. Everyone knows we had to cancel the car show for obvious reasons. The Heartland Chevelle Club is scheduled to host the 2021 Chevelle Regional. Greg Hanson, the president of the Heartland Chevelle Club, is having issues securing a hotel to host the Regional because of the uncertainty of the Covid virus and wants our club to host the 2021 Regional since we had to cancel our show. This is a decision our club will have to make early in the year because a Regional is a lot more work to put on then our annual Mid America Chevelle Car Show. Of the four clubs that participate in the Mid-West Regional, we are the only club that does not have the car show at a hotel. We try our best to run the Regional like we do our own show only with more options on things to do. We have a great sponsor in O'Reilly's auto parts store that gives us a nice sum of money to do the extra things needed to host a regional. My hope is that Heartland Chevelle club can secure a hotel and host the 2021 Regional and then in 2022 we can host that Regional.

What's 2021 going to be like? I think about this a lot and to be honest I have no clue and if someone says they know they are just guessing like the rest of us are. I could ask 25 different people and get 25 different answers. With that said it really makes it hard to plan events for next year. In January, the event staff always gets together to plan out the upcoming year. Think we will have to find a different way to make plans for 2021. If 2020 has taught us anything, you can't plan to far ahead because tomorrow things can change in a heartbeat. But Steve and I are always trying to think of new and safe ways to get together like the cruise we had this fall. By all accounts, everyone that participated in these cruises had a good time and it was a safe health wise as possible. I believe we have found a new event that we can continue doing for the next few years.

For me personally, this has been very frustrating year. The event staff had a ton of events scheduled that had to be cancelled. The Mid-West Regional car show was well planned out and was on its way to getting all of our ducks in row when Covid hit. To have to cancel the car show and the Christmas Party were hard decisions to make. I know not everyone agrees on some of





decisions we had to make, but we made these decisions with the safety of our membership and along with the financial risk involved in putting on these two events. I'm committed not to waste membership club dues money and when we do spend money, we want to get our money's worth.

I want to thank all the club officers, Brian Finley our newspaper editor, Steve Calder and the event staff members and car show committee members for their work and dedication to the club. Without all of them none of this could be possible. Also want to thank our club sponsor, Midwestern Mechanical Specialties- John Freeman, Hendricks Chevrolet and Don Burdolski with Hagerty Insurance.
