# Member's Corner

Steve and Lori Calder 1972 GMC Sprint Story

First of all you may wonder, What is a GMC Sprint? Most of you who have been around the MACC know because we happen to have two of them. For those that don't know the GMC Sprint is a little know variant of the Chevrolet El Camino offered to GMC dealers from 1971-1977. From 1978-1987 the GMC version was called Caballero. The Sprint had all the options available in the El Camino. The SS version was called an SP. From all the articles I have read and in talking to a couple of guys who worked on the assembly line at the Leeds plant the only difference between the Sprint and the El Camino was the GMC badging. GM produced 5536 Sprints in 1971 and 6473 in 1972 according to production numbers researched by Dan Carr.

I purchased my first GMC Sprint in 1975. At the time I was driving a 67 Camaro that was getting very tired. Lori and I were dating and she was still in college in Lincoln, NE when I decided I wanted to look for an El Camino as I had a friend who had one and I really liked it. I ended up buying a GMC Sprint from a used car lot in Lincoln. Purchased in March 1975 for \$1750 plus trade in of the Camaro. It was a 1972 GMC Sprint with a 454, TH400, bucket seat, round gauges cowl induction. VIN 5D80W2K501731. A true 454 Kansas City built Sprint. According to production numbers one of 38 with that engine and options. Of course, back in 1975 I had no idea how few were made as we all know they were our transportation.







I was driving this Sprint when Lori and I got married in May of 76 and most of the pictures I have of that Sprint were taken on our wedding day.

We had the "smart" idea to drive from the church to her folks house which was on a few miles away in Omaha riding in the back of the Sprint. We made the mistake of having her brother drive and instead of going directly to the house he took us around several of the shopping malls in Omaha with a whole string of cars behind. Luckily, we did not get thrown out and finally made it to the house very windblown.





In August of 1976 we traded the Sprint in on a 4x4 pickup because at the time we lived on a mud road in rural Nebraska and the Sprint was terrible in the mud. The dealer I traded in to told me that the Sprint was purchased by a local teenager who totaled it two weeks later. So that was the end of my Sprint owning days until March of 2006 when I started looking for a Sprint the same color as the first one.

I found one on line at a dealer south of Chicago. Talked to the dealer several times over a couple of weeks and decided to go take a look. Booked a Southwest flight to Midway Airport with a cancellable return ticket and headed to Chicago. Rented a car and drove south to the dealership. After hours of back and forth, a test drive and a trip to a local mechanic looking at it we finally struck a deal around 4:30 p.m. Took the rental car back to the airport the dealer picked me up and we went back to the dealership where I departed for home at 6p.m. with a 34-year-old car that I had only driven 10 miles! Decided after an hour or so I better stop for the night and continue the next day in the daylight. Made it home without any problems.





My yellow Sprint has a 350 4 barrel with TH400 with sweep speedo. This Sprint is pretty much a 20 foot driver quality with some issues and is my "Maybe someday I'll get it redone"!



Forward to March 2008 and I was purusing eBay and saw a 72 big block Sprint that was located in Merriam, KS. At KC Creations and Hot Rods/Big Dog Motorcycles. It did not sell on eBay but they had a "Buy it now" price on it. The pictures looked good so I called KC Creations and went to Merriam to look at it.

The Sprint had been through a frame off restoration and I liked it so I went home to talk to Lori about it and she said "When you sell the yellow Sprint" and I said "What"!!!

Well we did not sell the yellow Sprint and I was able to persuade her into buying the second Sprint. This one is a big block U code(402), cowl induction, TH400, round gauges, Baltimore built Sprint. Original color was Sequoia Green now HOK Kandy Tangerine. One of 83/6473 produced.



It has been fun having something different and I get a lot of comments about never seeing a Sprint, did not know GMC made one, to even some people telling me it's fake!





We have enjoyed many outings with this Sprint. It has been driven to many cruises, car shows and events over the last 12 years. Some of the longest adventures have been the Hot Rod Power Tour in 2018, Street Machine Nationals in Minneapolis and the 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary El Camino Show in Arlington, Tx in 2019.

Lori and I have had a blast in the Mid America Chevelle Club and have met some great people and made a lot of friends. My advice to is to attend some of the events with club members and drive that car.
