2021 Meeting Minutes

MID-AMERICA CHEVELLE CLUB MERRIAM, KS June 24, 2021 MINUTES

The meeting, located at Merriam Marketplace, Merriam, KS, was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Chair Roger Versatraete, with 25 persons present.

The minutes of the last meeting, as published in the newsletter, was discussed. It was noted the stipulations noted in the minutes referred to the Christmas party and donations, with the charities selected have no officers or others within the organization receiving more than \$100,000.00 annually. The minutes were accepted.

Mr. Verstraete talked about the actions at the May meeting and overviewed the 2019 party with expenditures and revenues for the event, adding the costs per couple was \$15.00 and individual at \$8.00. He noted there was a shortfall of \$900.00, so charity donations were impacted.

Mr, Verstraete then spoke about the 2021 estimate cost of the party. He noted that this year, Jack Stack BBQ would be charging \$18.50 per person, different from the pricing in the past year. He noted when all the associated costs of the event (security, rent, bartender, etc) that even with a charge of \$25.00 per person, \$50,00 per couple the event would still fall short of the projected costs. Mr. Smoot explained the rational for the Christmas Party, noting that more people attending this event may lead some to attend more of the other yearly events. It was noted there are some decisions to make regarding this event: 1.) charge \$10.00 per person; 2.) use last year's funding and \$2500.00 for the event; or 3.) find another location and new coordinators.

Mr. Byfield said that he now understands and sees the reason for the change. Mr. Cummins stated that the club does make a contribution to charity or family member loss. Mr. Gragg noted these such differences has been the downfall of other Chevelle clubs, noting some of have shut down, others divided. Mr. Scott stated that he is in favor of some charity donation with a budgeted amount. Mr. Farley indicated he belongs to another club which is similar, and the members will pay more for the Christmas party. Mr. Gilpin indicated that if there is a shortfall, what is the worse that could happen, less funds are banked. Mr. Hallouer stated that the income is less controlled, as expenditures can be addressed. Mr. Stack spoke about the sponsorship covered part of the party. Mr. Cunningham indicated that as for charity, there may be a desire to solicit to make more funding, and not give up the Christmas Party.

More discussion ensued. A call for the question was made with a motion by Mr. Gordon, seconded by Mr. Gragg, to have the Christmas Party at Thompson's Barn for \$25.00 per person.

Mr. Scott stated that this cost may cut attendance. The motion was approved with 11 in favor, 8 against, and 2 abstaining.

Regarding new business, the insurance premium for the club was raised due to the show parameters for Nebraska Furniture Mart. It was noted the Car Show Committee will meet in July.

The upcoming car/cruise events was reviewed which included the Olathe Police Veterans Cruise, and Good Guys Show in Des Mointes.

The Treasurer's report was accepted regarding income and expenditures. Those present were informed there are 81 current members.





Vehicle improvements, etc. was provided by members.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:14 p.m.

A cruise to Old Shawnee Pizza followed adjournment.

President's Column

Hi MACC,

Over the last two years, I decided I needed to do some upgrades to my red 70 hardtop that I've owned for the last 23 years. I have already done a lot of safety upgrades in the last 10 years like upgrading the suspension and adding four-wheel disc brakes. So, the first thing I did was get rid of the stock wheels and tires and change to 17" wheels with red line tires. Yes I know 70 Chevelle's never had red lines tires when they were new, but I was tired of the stock look and wanted something different that nobody else had. Then the winter of 2020 I decided to upgrade the comfort level and add Vintage Air. By the way, it was the best money I have ever spent on any Chevelle I've owned. The next project I wanted to do was replace the tired 396 engine that was in it and replace it with a date coded correct LS5 454 engine and add a Tremec 5 speed transmission. I already had the engine, it's been setting in my garage since 2015. When I bought my convertible from Dan Yuran, he had two date coded correct 1970 LS5 454 engines. One was slated to go into my convertible that I bought from him and the other was supposed to go into a 70 convertible that was painted and ready for assembly. But Dan had a change of heart and decided to put a LS engine in that one instead. I bought the extra 454 engine with the thought of installing in my red hard top at a later date.

Last October Eugene came over and we took the 454 down to John at Midwestern Mechanical. I told him I was in no hurry, just start on it whenever he had time. The engine was rebuilt around 2009 but was never run tested so I wanted John to open the engine up and check it out to make sure everything was alright. I didn't want any surprises after installing the engine that been setting around for over 12 years. After John disassembled the 454 he felt this was a very good engine and any engine upgrades was money well spent. So we decided to upgrade the cam and put roller rocker arms on the heads. When doing this, you needed to get taller valve covers. I wanted to keep the stock look of the original valve covers. I was able to find a taller style of stock looking valve covers and it's really hard to tell the difference. As most engine upgrades go, one thing leads to another. I decided to get rid of the stock low rise intake and install an aluminum intake, water pump and a new MSD distributor and coil. There were a lot of the engine brackets, the alternator, power steering pump, exhaust manifolds and miscellaneous parts that were coming off the old engine before John could run test the new engine.










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After pulling the old engine out of the car we were able to paint and reuse a lot of exsiting parts. As you can see everything looks brand new and the exhaust manifolds turned out great. I used POR15 high temp spray paint with a high gloss clear spray sealer on the manifolds. After that, the engine was ready to run test on the engine stand. Not to my surpise, it sounded great and I know now I have a engine that will last a very long time.

Here is a picture of the new Tremec 5 speed that's going in. This is the newest version from Tremec, the TKX. This new design has a smaller footprint and upgraded shift kit, and shouldn't need any tunnel modifications to install. When you buy the TKX kit it comes with new clutch, transmission yoke, all the bolts needed and the break in oil. This engine and transmission combination should give me everything I'm looking for, performance, drive ability and a lower RPM at 70 MPH. Well, that it is all I have for this month's LS5 upgrade. Next month I will be able to show you more pictures of the finished project.

Just one big club announcemet, this month's club meeting will be held at Hendrick's Chevrolet at 7pm. Want to thank the City of Merriam, Kansas for letting use the Merriam Market place for our meetings the last year or so.
