# **MACC Committee Updates**

#### MACC 2021 CHARITABLE DONATIONS

The Charitable Committee looked at several organizations within the Kansas City Region and awarded \$250.00 donations for worthy causes. Those awards were delivered to Wreaths Across America, Marine Toys for Tots Foundation, Due West Therapeutic Riding Center, Make a Splash! Co, and Earnest Shepherd Memorial Youth Center.





Wreaths Across America was started in 2007, after 15 years of wreaths placed at sites at Arlington Memorial Cemetery. Wreaths Across America's mission touches the lives of thousands of school, scout, civic and religious groups across the country through fundraising for wreath sponsorships. These groups help the organization's mission to place a wreath on each hero's grave. This is an organization which this club has providing a yearly donation for several years. It's mission, while nation-wide, does provide the goal of memorializing past veterans.

The mission of the **Marine Toys for Tots Foundation** is to assist the U. S. Marine Corps in providing a tangible sign of hope to economically disadvantaged children at Christmas. This assistance includes providing day-to-day leadership and oversight of the Program, raising funds to provide toys to supplement the collections of local Toys for Tots Campaigns, to provide promotional and support material and defray the costs of conducting annual Toys for Tots Campaigns. Other Foundation support includes providing administrative, advisory, financial, logistic and promotional support to local Toys for Tots Coordinators; managing funds raised and monies donated based on the use of Toys for Tots name or logo; providing other support the Marine Corps, as a federal agency, cannot provide; and conducting public education and information programs about Toys for Tots that call the general public to action in support of this patriotic community action program. The club's donation will provide toys within the Kansas City area.

**Due West Therapeutic Riding Center (Due West TRC)** was founded in 2013 and as the first program of its kind in Wyandotte County, Due West Therapeutic Riding Center (Due West TRC) provides therapeutic riding services to children and adults with disabilities and other therapeutic needs. Instructors are certified through PATH (Professional Association of Therapeutic Horsemanship) International to provide safe, fulfilling equine-related activities for therapeutic purposes. The program is designed to serve individuals with physical and cognitive disabilities; including autism spectrum disorder, Down syndrome, multiple sclerosis, developmental delay, cerebral palsy, limited mobility, emotional disorders and vision and hearing impairments. At this time, the organization is asking donations to replace a horse that is failing due to age and health. This club's donation will assist the goal in this replacement.

Make a Splash! Inc works with the newly injured and their families on the transition to life in a wheelchair. Mark Cameron became a C4-C5 quadriplegic as a result of a shallow water diving accident in September of 2004. He and his organization introduces life with a disability to ablebodied audiences and expresses the importance of making good choices in their daily lives. Mark set personal goals during his hospital stay. He determined he would breathe on his own before discharge. To the surprise of his doctors, he beat the ventilator machine in 3-1/2 months. In addition, he determined he would live independently upon his return home. Through state aid, he was able to acquire computer technology that allows him the necessary flexibility to move about his home and with help from volunteers he is living on his own. His personal journey placed tremendous impacts not only on Mark but upon his family and friends. As a result, Mark became passionate about patient advocacy.

Today Mark works with the newly injured and their families with respect to the adjustments and challenges of life in a wheelchair. Make a Splash, Inc. was born out of Mark's hope to provide the newly injured and their families a conversation regarding life in a wheelchair with someone who might be able to answer their questions. Mark's goal is to help those involved in this transition to navigate the challenges as smoothly as possible. In addition Make a Splash is an effort to introduce





to able-bodied audiences, life in a wheelchair and to share Mark's message of life in a wheelchair, diving awareness and the importance of making good friends and choices.

Mark speaks publicly about his accident and recovery. During his speaking engagements, Mark emphasizes the importance of making friends and how tremendous that has been to his recovery. His specific focus is how everyone benefits by fostering friendships and helping each other along the way. He finds that sharing what he has learned is a valuable lesson to pass along.

Earnest Shepherd Youth Center was established in 1962 and is known for setting the right stage for kids to explore leadership and teambuilding. Social skills are developed through innovative activities while making memories and seeing their own potential as well as in others. This organization provides Adventure Programs for schools which includes a radical challenge, and leadership workshops. Summer programs include week long day camps, and swimming lessons. In addition, youth development which includes facilities and opportunities for organized youth groups to carry out youth development mission by providing camp grounds, service projects and project meetings.

The sincere wish of the Charity Committee is that members of the MACC, which fundamentally enjoy the fun of our hobby or love, that of Chevelles, El Caminos, and their cousins - can truly also support local causes that benefit those in need within the Kansas City Metropolitan Area. We appreciate the honor of being allowed to select just a few of those worthy organizations for which a few dollars do mean a lot.
