#### MID-AMERICA CHEVELLE CLUB HENDRICK CHEVROLET, MERRIAM, KS October 28, 2022 MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Chair Roger Verstraete, with 19 persons present.

The minutes of the last meeting, as published in the newsletter, was accepted.

# President's Column

#### Hi MACC.

It's been awhile since my last newsletter article and just wanted to keep membership up to date on plans for 2022. Actually, a lot of us have been very busy planning for this year's car season. First of all, the Mid America Chevelle Club will be hosting this year's Midwest Chevelle Regional on September 23rd &24th at Nebraska Furniture Mart in Kansas City, Kansas. This will be a full two day car show starting on Friday morning and ending with awards late on Saturday afternoon. Our club was the host club for this same event in 2016 and it was a huge success. We had 165 cars from all over the Midwest and one participant came all the way from Miami, Florida and several others from Texas. This time around, we thought we would try to change it up some and have the car show at a hotel/convention center. Eugene and I worked on this for several months but we could never get the dates we needed or find the perfect place to hold this kind of event. So, in early January the car show committee decided NFM was the place to have the regional. In mid January, we held a zoom meeting where the committee worked out a lot of the details and got everyone involved doing specific jobs that needed to be planned out.

I know we have a lot of new members that have never been to a Chevelle Regional before. The Midwest Chevelle Regional is rotated around at 4 different Chevelle Club's locations. The Mid America Chevelle Club, Heartland Chevelle Club is out of Omaha, Nebraska, Queen City Chevelle club is out of Springfield, Missouri, Wichita Area Chevelle Owners is out of Wichita, Kansas. The Midwest Regional is a lot bigger car show and has more events than say our annual car show. First of all, you will have a choice of having your car judged in a stock class or a modified class with





awards going to the top 3 in each class and for each year. We will also have a 1,000 point judging class for those who want their car judged by professional judges. On Friday night, we will have a poker run/cruise that will go to Wyandotte County Lake and at the end of the cruise we will have a BBQ dinner at the club house for those who want to participant in this. The Regional is a two day car show but doesn't mean you have to be there on Friday. You can just come on Saturday if you choose. Saturday is the biggest day with all the judging and awards. This year we will be using some new judging hardware to make it easier for everyone to pick their favorite car for awards. We are expecting 150 to 175 Chevelle's from around the Midwest area and the quality of cars for this type of car show is outstanding. If you have never attended a Chevelle Regional before, I highly recommend that you come out this year and participate in this year's car show and support the club. We have over 100 club members and it would be great to reach 200 Chevelles and set a record for most cars at a Chevelle Regional. The record was set in 2017 when the Heartland Chevelle club had 180 Chevelles. When the car show flyer is finished, Brian will have it in the upcoming newsletters and it will have all the details and start times.

The MACC event committee met in early February and has planned out this year's events. Good news is, we are back planning a full schedule of events for this year and the first one is March 18th thru the 20th at the World of Wheels Car Show. If you attend, please stop by our booth and say Hi. Another event that has been put on hold because of Covid that was a big success in the past was the first Friday night cruise-in to a member's house is now back on for this year. The event committee also has decided to have two cruises like we did last year and the first one being in April. This year's summer picnic location has been moved to Shawnee Mission Park on Sunday, June 5th and the shelter house we are using is right next to the Marina. These are just a few of the events planned for this year and there will be some added as the year goes on. The whole event list for this year is in this month's newsletter.

I know I speak for everyone on the event staff and the car show committee that we hope we can get as many members to come out to our events. They try to have a mixture of different type of events to keep everyone involved in the club.

And the last thing is, we are going to have this month's club meeting at Hendricks Chevrolet at 7pm on Thursday, February 24th. Everyone stay safe and looking forward to seeing everyone again this year.

# **Vice-President's Column**

Happy 2022, MACC! I hope that the new year finds all of you doing well.

As some of you may know, I have been in the process of building a new house and moving to Paola, Ks over the last year. As you can imagine, this has been a large undertaking for us, and is one of the main reasons I have been absent from a lot of the club get togethers and activities last season.

Well, we are getting closer to completion thankfully! I'm ready to get back to living in a house again, though being in an RV for almost a year and a half. We have made it to the finishing stages of our build, and hope to be moved in during the coming months.





We built a fairly non-traditional house, it's what some would call a "shouse" or "barndominium". Basically, it's a big metal building that we split in half inside-- 50% house, and 50% shop. Being the car guy that I am, my main focus was with the shop side of things, while my wife calls all the shots on the house side. This arrangement has been working well for us, and I'm happy to say that it's turning out just as we hoped.



On the shop side, we went with a white metal panel inside to help keep the space bright and easy to maintain. I upgraded the lights to high output LED units that I installed myself, just to make sure that they were set and wired the way that I wanted. My wife surprised me with a "Big Ass" Fan (that's really the brand name) to help keep air circulating out there. That sucker is 12' across and really moves some air. It weighs a ton, so when I installed it, there was much bracing to be had so that it would stay put and not sway around.





Our concrete finishers had a bad day when they poured the shop side of things, and we were left with some fairly significant finishing issues to overcome. We all decided that the best fix





for the situation at hand was to grind the surface flat and add an epoxy coating. While this was essentially a fix for a problem, I view it as a big upgrade to the finish and presentation of the shop. SealKC came out and did a great job, and gave me exactly what I was looking for.



The work continues, and what we have left at this point on the shop side is to basically clean all of the surfaces, paint and finish the wall that separates the shop from the house, and install all the lifts and equipment that will make this a nice and functional hobby shop for all of my automotive projects. I have started putting some cars in there just to free up some space at work and can't wait to get things completed and finally get back to some wrenching.







As this project draws to a close, I hope to be able to attend more functions, and look forward to seeing you all soon!
