President's Column

Hi MACC,

Last week the car show committee had their final meeting to discuss all the details of this year's Midwest Chevelle Regional. All the planning and decisions that were made over the year were discussed and the eight members of the committee went over each of their responsibilities. After the meeting was over, I have to admit this is the most thought out car show we have ever put on. The car show committee has done a great job planning out this year's events and I believe this will be our best car show. This year's car show will be a full two days starting at 9am Friday, September 23rd and ending after the awards on Saturday, September 24th. Some of the highlights of this year's show will feature a Friday evening cruise/poker run that will end at the James P. Davis Hall in Wyandotte County Lake Park. At the end of the cruise, we will be having a catered BBQ dinner from Jack Stack BBQ including drinks and desert for anyone who wants to attend. If you like to attend this event on Friday evening, it would be best to pre-register your car and buy tickets ahead of time. We will only have a limited amount of banquets tickets available the day of the show. The reason for this is it is hard to guess how many people will want to



attend the banquet and have enough food on hand for everyone. Again please pre-register if you are planning to attend the Friday banquet.

Saturday registration will kick off at 8am and go through noon. We will have a food truck to serve breakfast and lunch on Saturday. Saturday will also feature 1,000 point judging for anyone wanting their car judged, but you have to pre-register your car by September 1st, and we are limiting this to the first 25 cars. This year there will be two different categories to have your car in, stock and modified. We will have the top 3 for each class and for each year and this is participant judge. There also are sponsor awards, specialty awards and best of show awards. Awards presentation is at 3:30pm and we will have over 80 awards to give out.

To pre-register your car, you have three ways to do this. You can go online and go to our web site: midamericachevelles.com and download a flyer. On the flyer there is a QR code you can scan that you can register online. Or you can fill out the car show flyer and send a check in by mail. You can also register at the car show registration tent the day of the show. Brian also has included the car show flyer in this month's newsletter. I know not everyone can make both days of the car show. If you cannot come on Friday, you can still just come for the Saturday part. Saturday is the day all the judging takes place and all the awards are presented. Also, this year we will have two different ways to do the participant judging. Each dash plaque will have a QR code on it and you can just pick your favorite cars using the app on your phone. If you don't feel comfortable doing this, you can still get a voting ballot at the registration table and just write down your favorite cars on the ballot.

Souvenir T-shirts will be available at the registration table. Usually we would have the shirts listed on the car show flyer but because of supply shortages and not knowing how much the cost would be at that time it was impossible to have them listed on the flyer this year.

I want to thank everyone on the car show committee for all their hard work getting this Regional car show planned. This has been very difficult year trying to figure out where to have the car show at, working around supply shortages, Covid, and figuring out the newest technology to pre-register and use it for participant judging. But I know all their hard work is going to pay off and we should have a great Chevelle Regional. In 2016 the Mid America Chevelle Club hosted the Midwest Regional Chevelle car show and we had 165 Chevelles at this show. We are planning for more this year. You don't want to miss out participating in this year's Regional. This only happens every 4 years so please consider coming out and supporting MACC.

The last thing here is we are still having our monthly meetings at Minsky's Pizza on Renner Road at 7pm. Hendricks Chevrolet is still closing at 6 o'clock because of lack of inventory. I also have gotten some club T-shirts and a few hats in and will have them at this month meeting.

Vice-President's Column

As most of you know, I've been working on outfitting and setting up my new auto "hobby" shop at home. While I have a couple "storage" 4-post lifts, I felt like I did need a "working" lift as well. I have purchased a couple different brand in the past, and most of my buying decisions had



largely been based on cost. While cost is always a concern, I decided to add a layer of safety (something new for me, I know) to the equation. I also wanted to make sure that I got one with enough lifting capacity to raise just about anything that I may want to work on in the future.

After much research, I settled on a Weaver 10,000 lb certified lift. (<http://www.derekweaver.com>) The main difference between a certified and a non-certified lift, is that the certified models have to go through some additional testing and gain the approval of the ALI (American Lift Institute). This lift has a lot of the features that I was looking for, plus as a bonus, it was black and matches the rest of my lifts in the shop. There was an extended wait period for this lift and took almost 6 months to arrive. Once here, it arrived in good shape and was packaged well. Side note for anyone ordering one of these- they are big and heavy, and some truck carriers require you to have some way to unload, so be prepared for that. I had mine delivered to our RV shop, so we used our forklift to unload with no issues.



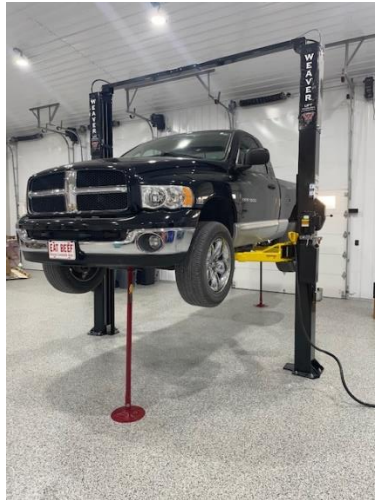
Once I got the lift home, it was a matter of unbolting the columns from the carrier, and laying all the pieces out roughly where they go prior to assembly. I did this solo with the help of my engine hoist, but would sure be easier with another set of hands. The directions are good and well written, and give you all the parameters to lay out placement. It is important to keep in mind distance to the door, walls, and any other obstructions to make sure that you don't have space limitations down the road. On my end, I had done quite a bit of pre-planning for this install. Since my shop has radiant floor heating, when I laid out the plumbing prior to concrete I had left a big area open with no tubing run through it specifically for this install. Just to be double-sure, once I had the lift columns set where I wanted, I did turn on the radiant flooring so that I could see exactly where the tubing was with my thermal imaging camera prior to anchoring anything to the floor. While it did make the shop even more toasty on a 100-degree day, the extra peace of mind it gave me before potentially drilling into a costly mistake was well worth it.



I then anchored the columns down, and started installing the column extensions, cables, and associated hydraulic lines. Got all of the arms installed, cables adjusted, lines bled, and power unit wired up. I did set up my power unit with a detachable cord, so that I could pull double-duty with a heavy extension cord and a 220v outlet for the lift and my welder-- worked out great!

Disclaimer: At one point in my life, I did install in-ground and above-ground lifts professionally. That being said, it has been many years since I did so- but it all came back pretty quickly. I'm happy to say that no mishaps were to be had, and everything went together well. I was kind of under the gun on this one, as I had big plans to do a brake job for a buddy in a couple of days, and wanted to try it on the new lift. I'm happy to say that everything worked as advertised, and I'm very happy with the product so far. As I get older, the thought of sitting cross legged on the floor or kneeling to do a brake job becomes less and less appealing. Sure was nice to stand upright and be able to walk around to grab the needed items without getting up and down off the floor. For anyone considering getting a lift-- if you've got the space and do any amount of your own work, I'd say go for it!
