MID-AMERICA CHEVELLE CLUB HENDRICK CHEVROLET, MERRIAM, KS April 28, 2023 MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 7:09 p.m. by President Verstraete. No visitors or new members, no introductions made.

The Minutes, as published in the newsletter, were accepted.

Mr. Verstraete informed those present that old business was in regards to the last month's budget presentation.

Next item discussed was the 2023-2024 election. It was noted that Brian Findley was nominated for the Vice-President. The motion was made to retain the current board, with end of term of Vice President for Mr. Smoot, adding Mr. Findley. The motion was accepted. The vote of the members was affirmative. All were congratulated.

Brian has been involved in the Christmas Party too by putting together the slide show that everyone watches during dinner. Brian has been a really big asset for MACC and I'm thrilled to be working with him this year.

Brian is going to step down as the newsletter editor and Kirby Demot will take it over. Kirby is one of the original members of the club and when I asked him if he was interested in taking over the newsletter, he was happy to do so. Kirby wanted to be more involved with the club and this is a perfect way for him to do that.

For me personally, one of the most fulfilling things about being president of the MACC is there is always someone wanting to step up and take on whatever is needed to keep things going in the right direction. We have several members who don't have an official title that are in charge of an event or help plan events like Tim Cunningham who takes care of planning the Christmas party for example.

I know I said this last month, but it needs saying again. I want to thank Ed Smoot for 13 years as Vice President. Ed has been one of the best club ambassadors MACC has ever had and I'm sure he will continue to be someone we can all count on in the future to be a big part of the club. After reading his article in last months newsletter, I thought I would look into my old computer and find a early article I wrote when I just became president. It's not one of the first ones, but I wrote it in August of 2011.

Now, on a note to General Motors: if you need someone to forecast the future, I'm available any time.

Why a Camaro not a Chevelle? Have you ever wondered why GM picked a Camaro to reenter the muscle car field 5 years ago instead of a Chevelle?

For me growing up, I was a fan of the Chevelle more so than the Camaro. My first love was the Corvette when I was growing up, but I knew my dad wouldn't ever let me have





one and I couldn't ever afford one of these legendary vehicles either. So, I shifted my interest to the Chevelle. I can remember my mom reading in the newspaper that Chevrolet was coming out with a new mid-size car called the Chevelle. I was 13 at the time and I knew that was going to be the car I wanted. Sure enough, my grandparents and my uncle bought one in 1964. Then in 1966, my cousin Jerry bought a new Malibu. In 1967, I was 16, and my dad let me buy a brand new 67 Malibu. It had a 283- 3 speed on the tree.

In 1966, Chevrolet came out with the Camaro to compete with the Mustang. The muscle car wars were on at that time. Everyone was building bigger motors and faster cars. But for me, no one could compare with the styling of the Chevelle. The Camaro was turning big numbers in production it was changing ever year. There were RS, SS, Z28, even plain Jane Camaro's. They used ever gimmick in the book to beat the Mustang. But the Chevelle sales where always strong year after year and they would out produce and out perform the competition. And finally, GM noticed how popular the Chevelle had been in the muscle car wars, outperforming the Ford's and Mopar's. So in 1970 Chevrolet came out with the most popular Chevelle ever built. They knew this was the last year they could build a true muscle car because of government regulations and pressure from the insurance companies. They sold a ton of the SS396-350hp cars and even built few with 396-375hp engine. Then in January, they came out with the SS454's. 360hp was standard engine but you could get the famous LS6. A 450hp engine was unheard of in those days and this car was scary fast. To this day, it is the most sought after Chevelle ever built. The innovations that GM put in this car have never been seen in a Chevelle before. From the hood stripes to the cowl induction, the styling of the 1970 seemed to be timeless. Now I know some of you 2 head light guys might argue some of these points, but the facts don't lie about this year of Chevelle. Never again could you get a 450hp engine in a Chevelle.

Even the 71's and 72's were riding the coat tails of popularity of the 70. With smaller motors, less horsepower, and 2 less headlights, these Chevelles were still very popular. It was the last chance to be a part of the muscle car era. So, what would have happen if GM would have picked the 70 Chevelle instead of the 69 Camero to restyle? I guess we will never know. But I think it would have been a bigger hit myself, but I'm prejudiced to the 70 Chevelle, if you haven't figured that out by now.

So where can you see some of the nicest Chevelles ever produced by Chevrolet? At the 10 th Annual "ACES" Mid America Chevelle Regional Car Show in Olathe Kansas, at the Great Mall of the Great Plains Mall. September 23-24. Come by and let me know what you think.

The weather has cooled off somewhat and we have a lot of events planned coming up, so watch your email and hope you can make some of these events. We always have a great time. If you have a friend or know someone with a Chevelle that is interested in the club, please feel free to bring them along.
