President's Column

Hi MACC,

Have you ever wondered what your Chevelle is worth? Some of you might not really care because you have no intention of ever selling your Chevelle. You might have plans of keeping your car in your family and just pass it down to your children some day. Others might want to know the value just so they can upgrade or change body styles or maybe you would just like to have a convertible to drive on these nice warm summer nights. We have some members change cars like they change underwear. They have a different Chevelle every time you see them. So why worry what your Chevelle is worth? First of all, owning a classic car is different than owning an everyday driver. If you get into a wreck with your everyday driver, you take it to the repair shop, pay the deductible, and you drive off hoping they fixed everything. Having an accident in a classic car is completely different. First, finding a restoration shop that will deal with insurance and repair are extremely difficult, and if the frame is bent you might just have a car the insurance company will want to total out. Now the fight is on. If you have a certified appraisal of your car, it will help a lot. There will be less of a hassle on the value of your Chevelle.

Let's compare these two 1970 SS Chevelles.



The red 70 is a number matching SS396 car with 2 build sheets and has less than 40,000 miles. It's all original and has been restored and is in great shape. The Black Cherry 70 does not have a number matching drive train but has a period correct big block. It too has been restored and is in great shape. Both cars are equipped with about the same options. Mileage on the black Cherry car is unknown and has no documentation to go with the car. The Black Cherry car could be just a clone dressed up as an SS. No way for the average guy to tell. Let's say the restoration of both 70's is about the same too. Okay which Chevelle would you want, and which one is worth more money? Tough choice! Both are beautiful cars.

The red car because of documentation to some people makes it worth more. I'm not a certified appraiser but believe it's worth 10 to 20 thousand more because of all the paperwork. The Black Cherry car is just as nice but doesn't have documentation and it hurts the value somewhat. This is why you need to have certified appraiser appraise your car. Looking at both cars to an insurance agent, he would say they are worth the same amount of money. But, if you can prove your car has





documentation with a certified appraisal you should be covered and get more for your car in case of an accident.

Okay, we figured out which one is worth more money, but which one would you want? The old saying in the Chevelle world goes (there are two types of Chevelle owners. Ones who own a 70 and ones who want to own a 70.) Just kidding I like all years but since I own two 70's I tend to favor the 1970 model year. For me I'd rather have the Black Cherry car. I'm not a big matching number guy. It's too easy to cheat to make a Chevelle look like it's a number matching car. The Black Cherry 70 car looks really nice and would not have to worry about the value if the engine went out and had to be replaced. You can drive it like you want and not worry about hurting the value of the car. You could add performance and safety upgrades and it would only help the value of the car. Now the red 70 looks great too and should have all the original parts on it, but again if the engine goes out the value of the car drops a lot. It also comes down to personal preference on what type of Chevelle you like. There are completely stock, modified, or resto-mod Chevelles. There is a big market for so called number matching cars, but I believe that number drops some each year because people are realizing it's way too easy to cheat to make them appear they are a number matching vehicle. And let's face some facts here, what is the chance a Chevelle still has its original engine in it after 50 plus years. These cars were built to be abused and misused in the day. I know because that's what I did with both of my Chevelles when I was a teenager. My 70 SS had 25,000 miles on it when I sold it after I got married and I can guarantee you that 396 has been melted down many decades ago.

To me a piece of paper ''build sheet" doesn't make it run, drive, or handle any different than a car without a build sheet. The only thing a build sheet proves is what options came on the car. Just one last fact about build sheets. Every plant seemed to put build sheets in different places inside the car. Some SS models didn't come with a build sheet they were discarded at the plant or a certain shift didn't want to put them in the cars. Does this not make them a SS car? I think not. I could go on and on about this topic but it's been beaten to death already.

In conclusion, I hope everyone will consider having their Chevelle appraised by a certified appraiser for their own protection.

Well that's for this month, hope to see membership at some of the different events that are coming up.


