Another great annual show, multiple MACC members always attend this event that usually boasts over 2,000 vehicles of all types.




September 23: MACC Car Show, Kansas City, KS

Hello MACC,

I would like to start my article by saying "THANK YOU" to all our members, sponsors, and car show committee for helping MACC have a successful 36th Annual All Chevelle Car Show. Despite the challenges we had during the day we had a very successful show.





Have you ever started a project by saying this shouldn't take long? Well, I have one of those projects currently underway and I do mean underway. As of today, I have spent a total of 12 hours trouble shooting trying to get the stereo working in our newly purchased 71.

As many of you know, I recently purchased a 1971 Malibu. The car came with a newly installed stereo to include a new head unit, new wiring, and speakers. Unfortunately, there is no sound. The unit powers on, I can cycle the unit through all its functions, yet there is still no sound. So, my next thought was to make sure the speaker wiring is not pinched and grounded out. That checked out, so grounded speaker wiring was not the issue.

Next, I pulled the plug from the back of the unit to check to see if there were any wires that could be grounded out that would impact the amplifier that is internal. All wires checked out okay and none were grounded.

Next, I contacted the manufacturer of the unit, explained to them what I had and requested a manual with the wiring diagram. They told me there were two terminals that require 12 volts, one wire (red) should be connected directly to 12 volts, the other wire (orange) should be connected to the ignition side, so hot when the key is on. Those wires were reversed, so as instructed, I made the switch. The unit still powers on, unfortunately I still don't have any sound.

So, I will be contacting the previous owner so I can find out who did the installation to see if they might have any type of guarantee with their installation. If not, I am not sure where I will go next.

I don't know about you who are reading this article, but for me, I know saying "This shouldn't take long" always proves me wrong. I am sure at some point I will get to a resolution.
