President's Column

Hi MACC,

Back in 2009, I joined the Mid-America Chevelle Club. I had owned my 1970 Chevelle for about ten years, but I really hadn't done much with it. It was time to either get serious about the car and start enjoying it — or let it continue to sit. I decided the best way to get motivated was to join the Chevelle Club here in Kansas City.



I only knew one person at my first meeting — Rocky Hill. I met Rocky at a car show, and he told me about the club. When I walked into that first meeting and saw Rocky, he happened to be the president at the time.

I was only a member for about nine or ten months when election time came around and Rocky decided to step down. Being part of an organization — and eventually helping lead one — was something I had always wanted to do. I was getting close to retirement and knew I would need something to stay active and involved. So, I put my name in the hat.

Another newer member at the time, Ed Smoot, said he would be willing to serve as vice president. Ed and I didn't know each other well at first, but after a few meetings and conversations, it became clear we were on the same page. We both believed the club had room to grow.

We were elected president and vice president, and right away we agreed on two main goals: increase membership and increase attendance at our annual car show.

That first year, that's exactly what we focused on.

We began handing out car show flyers at other local shows to let people know there was a Chevelle club in Kansas City and that we held our annual show at the Great Mall in Olathe, Kansas. Slowly but surely, membership began to grow, and car show attendance followed.

About three years in, with perfect weather on our side, we had 155 cars at the show — one of the most successful events we had put on in a long time.

Ed was a tremendous help. There wasn't anything he wouldn't do. We both believed in getting the word out, keeping the club active, and building something members could be proud of.

At around that same time, Rocky and Sherry moved to southern Missouri to retire, and we needed someone to coordinate events. I asked Steve Calder if he would be interested, and he stepped right in. Under Steve's leadership, the club increased activities and visibility. We were doing more and getting out in the community more than ever before.

As the years went by, the club continued to grow. We became part of the Midwest Chevelle Regional Coalition and were awarded the 2016 Midwest Chevelle Regional. We hosted it at Cabela's at The Legends, and it turned into an incredible weekend. We had 165 Chevilles in attendance from all over the Midwest — even one participant who drove up from Miami, Florida. The weather cooperated, everything ran smoothly, and it was a special moment for our club.

After a few years in the role, I also came to fully appreciate how important it is to have the right people in the right positions. One person I depended on heavily was our treasurer, Eugene. He has served in that role for nearly 30 years and knows the financial and historical side of this club better than anyone. His steady leadership and attention to detail have provided stability year after year. In my opinion, Eugene has been an underappreciated asset to this club for a very long time.



Another key part of our success has been the newsletter and the people behind it. When I first joined, Deborah Gragg served as newsletter editor, mailing out printed copies before we eventually transitioned to email. Deborah, along with her husband John, has filled many roles over the years, including recording secretary, and has always worked hard during our car shows.

After Deborah stepped down, Mike Stites took over and did a fantastic job continuing the tradition. When Mike retired and moved to southern Missouri, he helped ensure a smooth transition to Brian Finley, who stepped in and continued producing a quality newsletter. When Ed later stepped down as vice president, Brian moved into that position as well.

I then asked Kirby Demott if he would be interested in taking over the newsletter. Kirby has taken it to another level, filling it with photos and detailed updates that truly showcase what our members are doing. I regularly hear compliments about how informative and well put together it is.

Following the 2016 Regional, I began noticing another change — and it was a good one. The Mid-America Chevelle Club was becoming more than just a car club. It was becoming a social club as well. Real friendships were forming. Members weren't just attending meetings; they were building relationships that extended beyond the cars. Our membership continued to grow, and it was rewarding to see new members welcomed in and quickly become part of the group.

We continued hosting our annual car show in 2018 and 2019, moving the event to the Nebraska Furniture Mart parking lot after they approached us about partnering together. They have been a great partner and have helped us continue to grow our show and our visibility.

After the success of 2016, we were awarded the 2020 Midwest Chevelle Regional. We had everything planned — location secured, dinner arranged, and the weekend schedule set. Then COVID happened.

The pandemic forced us to cancel the 2020 Regional. It was a difficult decision, and there was no handbook on how to run a car club during a pandemic. With the support of our leadership team, we adapted. Instead of stopping completely, we began holding meetings outdoors at the Merriam Marketplace farmers market area, thanks to our sponsor John Freeman of Midwest Mechanical Specialties and his connection with the City of Merriam. We met outdoors throughout 2020 and 2021, keeping the club together during uncertain times.

In 2021, with too many unknowns still in place, we postponed hosting the Regional again. Later that year, as restrictions eased, we organized a one-day car show. Around 100 cars showed up, and the enthusiasm was strong. People were ready to get back out and enjoy their cars.

One surprise during that time was membership. I expected numbers might decline. Instead, membership increased. People were buying cars, working on projects, and looking for something positive to be part of. The club didn't shrink — it grew.

By 2022, we hosted the Midwest Chevelle Regional again, and it was a great success.



After the 2022 season, I began seriously thinking about an exit strategy. I never imagined I would serve as president this long. Things were running smoothly, and I was still enjoying it, but I knew it was time to start lightening the load.

Brian Finley stepped up as car show chairman while also serving as vice president. Steve Calder continued doing an outstanding job as event coordinator. My role became more supervisory, ensuring things stayed on track.

When Steve prepared to step down, he encouraged Shannon to take over the event coordinator role. Shannon stepped in and has done an excellent job, continuing to build strong events for the club. We've been fortunate to have event coordinators who truly care about keeping the club active and organized.

About a year ago, Eugene and I had an honest conversation about timing. With his nearly 30 years as treasurer, he was also considering stepping back. We agreed it wouldn't be wise for both of us to step down at the same time. Stability matters. So we made a plan: I would step down first, and Eugene would remain for one more year to ensure a smooth transition.

Sixteen years ago, I joined this club because of a car. What I gained was far more than that. I gained friendships, memories, and the opportunity to be part of something truly special. To everyone who trusted me to lead, stood beside me, volunteered their time, and supported the club along the way — thank you. It has been a privilege to serve as your president, and I look forward to continuing as a proud member of this great club.




